American recipes show odd ingenuity

Cake baking is an Old World art, but American ingenuity has developed some recipes — salad dressing cake, for one. Some people make it with mayonnaise. Sauerkraut chocolate cake is another oddity that tastes a lot better than it sounds. In fact, most people think the kraut crunch comes from coconut. The recipe was developed in the 1960s by a school food-service nutritionist wanting to use kraut in the school lunch program.

Tomato soup cake, developed by The Campbell Soup Co., was first published in one of the company's recipe booklets in 1925. Versions of it have been showing up in other cookbooks since that time.

A five-foot-tall salad dressing chocolate cake baked to mark the 50th anniversary of the

introduction of Miracle Whip brand dressing, is Kraft's version of a boiled dressing that looks like mayonnaise but has a lower fat content. A family size version of the cake is the company's most requested recipe, says Dorothy Holland, vice president for consumer affairs.

The dressing in it replaces the eggs and shortening or butter. Holland said company files don't provide any specific clues as to its origins or its developer.

"It's been associated with Miracle Whip (salad dressing) continuously since the 40s," she said. "It's the only (recipe) people ask for by name."

Mayonnaise cake recipes were found in cookbooks published in 1968 and 1972 but there was no information about the recipes' origins.

So we asked a manager at The Best Foods division of Products International who responded with a photo of a company house organ dated December 1937. There, the daughter of a mother and well have been the cake.

The story said it had developed by the wife of a Foods salesman Paul Eugene, Ore., who was trying to help her husband sell a product by getting all her friends to try the cake.

CHICAGO — Back in the 1930s, one of the big sellers in glassware was a pink shade famous now — and valuable — as Depression glass.

Half a century later the nation is in another major economic slump, and here comes America's largest glassware manufacturer with a line of glasses in a shade of pink that looks remarkably familiar.

John Meier, director of marketing for Libbey Glass, said his company's designers had fashion, not history, in mind when they came up with Misty Rose. He said they looked at the earth tones, popular in tablecloths and place mats, and realized they had nothing to coordinate with them.

Coordinate is the key word in the gigantic housewares industry, which put on its 78th semi-annual exposition recently at Chicago's McCormick Place.

Dish towels match, hotpotters match, aprons match, teapots match, and pots and

pans match, would you believe, vacuum cleaners?

There was Hoover, with all its equipment available in a wide variety of bright or pastel acrylic plastics, including poppy red, camel and two shades of blue.

A new technique for diagnosis of heart disease may be worth its weight in gold — radio

gold.

Researchers in the U.S. and Great Britain have found radioactive gold injected into the bloodstream produces a clear computer image of a patient's heart while exposing patient to much less radiation than does technetium, the element now used in this procedure.

"An equivalent dose of gold gives twenty times less radiation to the whole body," says Wackers, a cardiologist at the University of Vermont, who is conducting clinical trials.

According to a Science report, it takes just 10 seconds for the gold to enter and pass through the heart time enough for a camera to record the radiation emitted for a computer to use the construct a picture of the heart.

The major advantage of radioactive gold is that it is much faster than technetium. Its half-life is only 30 seconds compared to the six-hour half-life of technetium.
