want the makeshift camp for the jobless closed, appeared headed for a noon showdown Thursday with fire marshals alarmed by a fire death in the camp.

Following a tent fire fatality Wednesday, Harris County Fire Marshal J.J. Pruitt sent an order requiring elimination of fire hazards to the 150 residents of a roadside park on U.S. 90 about 30 miles east of Houston.

Investigator Bill Cunningham said arson was suspected in the midnight blaze. James R. "Scotty" Bolland, 41, a British native who last lived in Washing-

Pruitt's order said: "One person has died, and several fire injuries occurred. Severe fire safety problems shall be corrected to prevent further deaths and injuries at this site."

Chief Fire Investigator Shelton Lawson said officials in-tended to evacuate the camp of violators at "high noon" Thurs-day if Pruitt's requirements are


