Jobless rate falls to 10.4 %

WASHINGTON — The Bureau of Labor Statistics gave President Ronald Reagan as good a birthday present as it could on Friday — a report showing a drop in the nation's unemployment rate to 10.4 percent.
Reagan, at a White House news conference less than three hours after the report was released, called it "one more sign that America is on the mend."

The announcement came at a time of increasing pressure by congressional Democrats for legislation to create jobs, and clear signs that Republicans in Capitol Hill were reuniting despite opposition by the White House.
The seasonally adjusted 10.4 percent rate for January was the first decline since the recession began 18 months ago. It reflected a drop of 0.4 percentage points from December's 10.8 percent level, which was the highest since the end of the Great Depression.

Labor Statistics Commissioner Janet Norwood cautioned that seasonal adjustment factors may have exaggerated the January decline because of unusually mild weather and slower-than-normal sales in the Christmas season.
The report showed 11.4 million persons officially unemployed in January, a drop of 590,000 from December. Total employment, however, increased by only 10,000 to 99.1 million.

because it showed no upsurge in jobs.
Kirkland said the decrease occurred because of the reduction of 600,000 persons from the civilian workforce.
"Behind the statistics, a cruel fact remains," Kirkland said, "unemployment is still an intolerable record-high level."
However, Republican Sen. Pete Domenici of New Mexico, chairman of the Senate Budget Committee, said it "is the solid sign yet that economic recovery is at hand."
An alternative jobless rate issued by the Labor Department that adds 1.7 million members of the military stationed in the United States as part of its workforce showed a 10.2 percent rate in January, down 1 percentage point from the rate calculated to be a 10.7 percent rate in December.

Arkansas senator wants cut in state spending

WASHINGTON — In the first response to a call for senators to propose defense budget cuts in their home states, Sen. David Pryor, D-Ark., says he wants to cut \$158 million for highly controversial nerve gas production.
Sen. John Tower, R-Texas, chairman of the Armed Services Committee, has yet to hear from 98 other senators in response to his call for them to scrutinize their own states if they want to reduce President Reagan's proposed \$238.6 billion military budget.
In a "Dear Colleague" letter last week, Tower noted the congressional debate over Reagan's rearmament program and said, "If senators are truly committed to cutting the defense budget, then there should be military installations or contractor operations in every state which are candidates for reduction."
In his reply letter Friday, Pryor said he realized he would be breaking tradition by suggesting a cut in his own state but proposed elimination of \$62 million for chemical weapons

and \$96 million for equipment for a total 1984 savings of \$154 million. The weapons are manufactured in Pine Bluff, Ark.
"I might point out that \$1 billion to \$8 billion by terminating the entire binary chemical weapons program," he said.
Pryor said it was not difficult for him to make the suggestion.
"My opposition to nerve gas production has never been a provincial nor entirely budgetary," he said. "Therefore, I do not want the activity transferred to another location in the country nor the funds reprogrammed."
The old Pine Bluff area was built for use in World War II and later became the National Center for Toxicological Research. In 1979, Congress approved funds to refurbish a facility to produce a new variety of nerve gas.
