The conference will include approximately 250 to 300 students from the University of Houston, North Texas State University, the University of Oklahoma, Oklahoma State University and Texas A&M.

While at the conference, delegates will discuss RHA programs and exchange ideas for future programs and leadership in dormitories, Tracy Moy, RHA conference chairperson, said.




