The Friday seminar focuses on regional motor fuel fore casting and will be presented by Dr. David Greene of Oak Ridge National Laboratory and Dr. Ken Monts of the Texas Energy and Natural Resources Advisory Council (TENRAC). The meeting is scheduled for Room 402 of

The first seminar was held in December and concentrated on a computer model for oil and gas supply.

The six meetings are being sponsored by the university's Center for Energy and Mineral Resources as a way of familiarizing Texas A&M researchers with TENRAC's computer capabilities and their potential use in studies here.

No dates have been set for the remaining seminars, which will discuss computer studies of gas transmission networks, a petroleum refinery, four types of energy demand and electricity supply and demand.




