pended Tuesday from his job for releasing five dogs he was ordered to put to sleep, officials

Rosenberg Police Chief Dwayne Sparks, acting on the recommendation of a police review board, suspended Daniel Barnshaw, an employee at the city's Animal Control officer for

the past 16 months. Police Lt. John Plummer said
