... McCracken said. But now, McCracken said, knowledge of the number is not widespread as it was last semester. Now security is more important to the residents and they're

using more common sense. They're taking it more seriously."

To ensure that the combination to the five-digit lock is kept fairly confidential, the number is changed after each semester and may be changed again at

spring break, McCracken said.

Residents of Mosher and Krueger halls can expect a similar combination lock system to be installed by summer, housing operations supervisor Ferris said.

Additional measures also are

being taken to increase security on campus, Ferris said.

He said additional lighting will be installed around Underwood, Briggs and Legett halls. Also, as part of a summer renovation project proposal, peep holes may be installed in modu-

lar halls as well as Mosher and Krueger, he said.

Besides the addition of mechanical improvements, some organizations are volunteering their time to upgrade campus security. University Police representa-

tives will be in the A-1 lounge from 5 to 9 p.m. today to answer questions about recent incidents on campus in observance of National Crime Prevention Week. The film "How to Say 'No' to a Rapist" will be shown at the meeting.

United Press International LANCASTER, Pa. — It was a matter of bad timing for a man accused of robbing a bank on Police Appreciation Day, a police spokesman says.

The suspect, Kenneth Ford, of Lancaster, was collared within an hour of the incident by officers who rushed from an annual luncheon at the sound of a burglar alarm, Sgt. Jack Farrell said Tuesday.

He said about 50 police officers were attending the luncheon sponsored by the Lancaster Kiwanis Club when the alarm sounded.

"I'll tell you, this guy really picked the wrong day to rob a bank," Farrell said. "Man, you never saw a banquet-room empty so fast."

Ford was arrested after he was found hiding inside a house. There he had been chased by Kenneth Brown, an attorney and bank customer who was at the Hamilton Bank branch when the alarm sounded.

United Press International NEW YORK (UPI) — The city says it is going to use air reconnaissance photographs to track down thousands of private swimming pool owners who have not paid their \$45 pool fee.

City officials said Tuesday the photographs were made last summer by the Department of Environmental Protection.

DEP asked contractors to bid the job of matching up those photos with map overlays to determine street addresses of every pool owner.

Anyone who does not show up as having paid the annual \$5 fee, will be given notice they are in arrears.

### to buried debts

United Press International BECKLEY, W.Va. — A wholesale casket dealer has denied he threatened to dig up coffins for which he was allegedly not paid.

A hearing has been set for Feb. 25 in Cabell County Circuit Court on a suit filed by Attorney General Chauncey Browning against Ben F. Williams Jr. and Williams Enterprises Inc. of Beckley. Browning said Williams' firm provided caskets to Ferrell Mortuary Inc. in Huntington last year, but Ferrell was not able to make immediate payments on the caskets.

The suit stated Williams then listed the names of people who had bought the caskets in which their relatives were buried and demanded the people pay him the cost of the casket in which their relative was interred.

The suit also stated Williams threatened to take back the caskets even though the deceased had been buried in a casket.
