Family plagued by crib deaths

DALTON, Ga. — An investigation into the deaths of over three generations of about 20 babies — all from the same family — could uncover the first evidence that sudden infant death syndrome is hereditary, doctors say.

Health officials, who called the possibility "frightening," began trying Wednesday to determine how many of the infants were killed by the syndrome, commonly known as "crib death."

"This is unheard of," said Dr. Richard Naeye, chairman of the pathology department at Penn State Medical College and an expert on sudden infant death syndrome.

"The big studies that have been done nationwide suggest heredity has nothing to do with sudden infant deaths. We need to try to find out exactly what happened to these children."

Officials said they learned of the deaths after questioning Lloyd and Terrie Lee Greeson, whose 3-week-old boy died Monday of SIDS — the third baby the Greesons have lost to the syndrome in the past two years.

"We investigated the death to make sure there was no foul play involved. The parents said they knew of about 20 deaths on the wife's side of the family from mysterious causes," Dalton Police Capt. Morris McDonald said.

Officials said an autopsy be conducted on the body of Greeson's baby, John Allen, to try to determine whether his breathing mechanisms were impaired.

Whitfield County Commissioner Leon Helton said health department officials confirmed the deaths in a check of birth certificates and began questioning more family members to determine the exact cause. Helton said the certificates listed the deaths as unexpected or from natural causes.

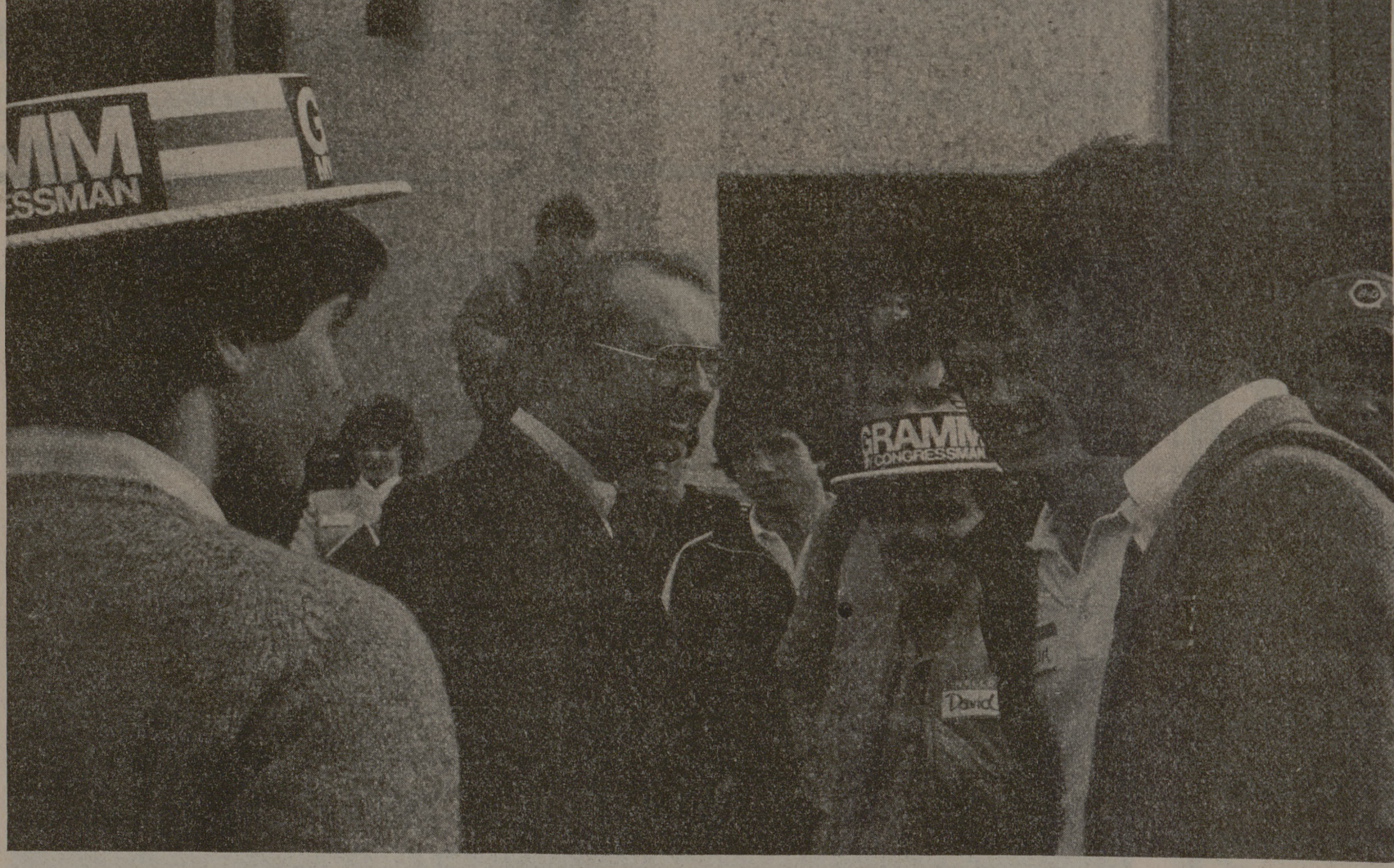
Naeye said SIDS is considered to be caused by emotional factors during pregnancy that damage the infant's mechanisms to control breathing.

"Mothers can have problems in successive pregnancies, the damage more than one child. Several families in the United States have lost three children. But this family has supposedly lost 20 children over three generations," said Naeye, graduate was notified of the deaths. Whitfield County Health Department.

The Greesons used a system device to monitor the breathing of their third infant after he was brought home from the hospital, McDonald said.

"The system indicated the baby had stopped breathing, but they called the medics, but the baby died at the hospital 30 minutes later," McDonald said.
