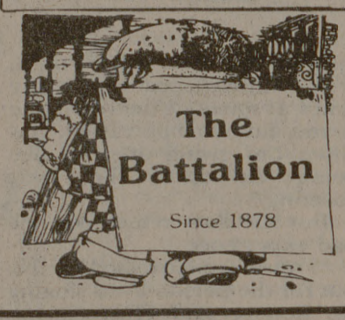

Groups support DWI bill

AUSTIN — A coalition of groups seeking tougher penalties for driving while intoxicated threw up a united front today in support of a bill sponsored by Sen. Bill Sarpalis, D-Amarillo.
The bill was endorsed at a news conference by Col. Jim Adams, director of the state Department of Public Safety, and the Texas Commission on Alcoholism and Mothers Against Drunk Drivers.
Adams said the 17-member Texas Task Force on Traffic Safety, which he directed under former Gov. Bill Clements' administration, also supports the measure.
"Potential violators must realize that if they drive while intoxicated, they are likely to be apprehended and certain to be punished," he said.
The bill would raise fines, eliminate deferred adjudication, allow refusal of defendants to submit to blood test to be used as evidence in a trial and allow probation only on the first offense.
"We're trying to create a deterrent and not put more people in jail," said Adams. "This plugs the loopholes to the point where

an individual knows if he drives while intoxicated he will likely be caught and will certainly be punished.
Sarpalis said he expected a tough fight in the Legislature since the liquor lobby will probably oppose the measure. And House Speaker Gib Lewis has not said which, if any, DWI forms he will support.
"It's very important that we get this out of the Senate because we're going to have work cut out for us in the House," said Sarpalis. "We're going to have a battle on hands in this session."

Sale of coal land may increase tax

ELGIN — Property taxes could double in Bastrop County because of large purchases of coal land by the city of San Antonio, county commissioners said today.
San Antonio for the past 18 months has been buying property with significant deposits of lignite, a low grade coal, in areas centered in Bastrop County.
The problem, Bastrop officials say, is that the property will be eliminated from county rolls. Under the Texas Constitution, a city cannot be charged county taxes on land it owns.
The hardest hit areas of Bastrop County will be the Elgin and McDade school districts which stand to lose \$7 per acre and the Lexington district in Bastrop County. The entire county budget is only \$2.1 million.
Bastrop County commissioners scheduled a meeting Monday to discuss the situation.
