Convict stabs fellow inmates

United Press International CHESTER, Ill. — A convicted killer with a "lust for murder" may have stabbed mass sex slayer John Wayne Gacy and another death row inmate in hopes of postponing his own date with the electric chair, authorities say

thorities say.
The Menard Correctional Center was placed on lockdown status Tuesday after Gacy, 43, killer of 33 young men and boys, was stabbed once in the upper left arm, said Nic Howell, state Department of Corrections

William Jones, 28, of Mount Vernon, convicted last year in the stabbing death of an elderly woman, suffered superficial wounds to the head in the incident, Howell said.

Gacy and Jones were taken to the prison infirmary for treatment and later returned to their cells, said prison officials who were searching for the weapon, believed to be a sharpened wire. Howell said the attacker,

Henry Brisbon, 27, convicted of four murders including the death of an inmate, broke away from a security officer who was accompanying him to the law library on the second tier of the death row unit.

Although he was tackled by the security officer almost immediately, Howell said, Brisbon was able to stab Gacy and Jones,

who were outside their cells ing a routine cleaning





Brisbon was senten death last year after bein victed of using a sh handle from a soup ladle inmate Richard Morg October 1978 at the Sta Correctional Center near where he was serving a se of 1,000 to 3,000 years for I-57 slayings.


Execution dates for Brish and Jones have not been pending their appeals.
