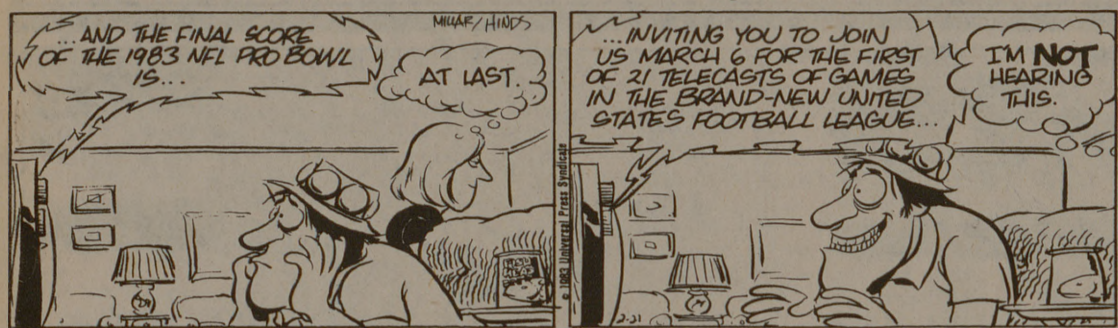

Aggie results

Men's track team finishes third in Southwest Conference Indoor meet

The Aggie men's track team, faltering in the final event of the Southwest Conference Indoor Championships, had to settle for third place in the nine-team meet, held Friday in Fort Worth. The Texas A&M women's team, paced by Suzanne Sheffield's first-place finish in the 880-yard

dash, placed fifth in the meet with 22 points.

Coach Charlie Thomas' men's team, in second place ahead of the Houston Cougars before the mile relay event, dropped the baton on the first exchange while leading the pack. As a result, the Cougars finished the event in second place and the meet in third place, while Texas A&M didn't place in the event and wound up the meet in third with 61.3 points.

The Arkansas Razorbacks won the men's event with 147 points and the Cougars finished second with 63. The Lady Cougars won the women's division with 158 points and the Texas Longhorns were second with 88.

— Tony Tolson, first in 600-yard dash, 1:10.02. **School record and season best** for Tolson.

— Robert Windsor, fifth in shot put, 59-5.

— Two-mile relay, fifth, (Lazarine, Ames, Elliott, Kyle Beal), 7:49.69.

— Bart Daniel, third in 880-yard dash, 1:52.97. **School record.** (Daniel, usually a hurdler, hadn't competed in this event

until a week before the conference meet, when he ran in Dallas Times Herald Invitational. He broke the school record both times).

— James Washington, long jump, 24-11 1/4. **Season best.**

— Rob Montgomery, Bruce, Ricky Wright, all pole vault, 16-0.

Tennis teams keep winning; men take Aggie tournament

The Texas A&M tennis squads continued their strong

spring play by winning five out of seven matches during the weekend.

By defeating Southwest Texas State, North Texas State and LSU to win this weekend's Texas A&M 4-way tournament, the Aggie men's team hiked its record to 9-1 on the season. Texas A&M, not ranked in national polls after finishing No. 19 last spring, had lost its first match of the season Tuesday by a score of 8-1 to fifth-ranked Trinity.

The women's team, competing in the University of Arkansas Invitational Thursday through Sunday, defeated Memphis State 9-0 Thursday to move its season record to 5-0. However, the Aggies lost to the Razorbacks 7-2 on Friday before bouncing back to topple Wichita

State 7-2 on Saturday. A&M then lost to Oklahoma Sunday in the final match of the tournament to finish with a third place in the tournament.

In Saturday's men's tournament, Aggie No. 1 seed Brian Brantley defeated LSU's No. 1 seed Steve Wood 6-2, 6-4, 6-4 in the match with the Texas A&M coach Dave Dancy called the squad "my best yet." Kent said: "The win over LSU was an important victory for us. It was a quality team and a real war. We really love LSU. The seniors are 2-2 against them. It was a super team with clutch victories in singles." (Ron) Kowal and (Arnie) tenacker, who both won set victories.

"We played well the weekend and we have our top teams in the country," said Dancy.

In Aggie victories over west Texas State (9-4), Texas State (5-1) and LSU (5-0), Kowal and tenacker were the stars in singles.

Kent said the women's team, which has a 6-2 record this season, played well against the Razorbacks in Sunday's match.

"The team played very well the last match," he said. "The women's teams in the conference were very close to beating us. It was a fine team effort."
