Woman's illicit sex nets jail

United Press International ISLAMABAD, Pakistan An Islamic court sentenced a woman to 20 lashes and seven years in jail for giving birth to an illegitimate child, the English language newspaper The Muslim said.

The report Monday said the woman, identified only as Bashiran, from a village about 275 miles southwest of Islamabad, was acquitted for lack of evidence on another charge of murdering the child.

The child was allegedly strangled by Bashiran and its body discarded in the country outside the village by her husband, the report said. Bashiran was arrested by
