## Woman's illicit sex nets jail

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan — An Islamic court sentenced a woman to 20 lashes and seven years in jail for giving birth to an illegitimate child, the English language newspaper The Muslim said.

The report Monday said the woman, identified only as Bashiran, from a village about 275 miles southwest of Islamabad, was acquitted for lack of evidence on another charge of murdering the child.

The child was allegedly strangled by Bashiran and its body discarded in the country outside the village by her husband, the report said.

Bashiran was arrested by police following a complaint by villagers.

## Toronto hospital named

# 7 infants killed by drug

TORONTO — A U.S. medical investigation into 28 deaths at a children's hospital confirmed

seven were killed deliberately with the heart drug digoxin and 21 others may have received overdoses of the drug.

The deaths, mostly infants, occurred in the cardiac ward of Toronto's Hospital for Sick Children between July 1980 and March 1981, when the ward's death rate increased from a normal 1.5 per month to five per month.

"There are 28 deaths for which the findings regarding the cause of death are not inconsistent with digoxin overdose," Attorney General Roy McMurtry told the legislature Monday, quoting a report by the Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta.

"In seven of these cases, there is significant scientific evidence that death was caused by deliberate overdose of digoxin."

McMurtry said no decision has been made on whether criminal charges would be initiated, but police would have a report ready early next month. The names and ages of the dead have not been released.

"It remains to be decided whether there is sufficient evidence to identify the perpetrator. This matter rests with the law enforcement authorities," McMurtry quoted the U.S. report as saying.

The Atlanta center visited by the hospital to investigate the mysterious deaths, attorney general pledged no criminal charges would be recommended unless a public inquiry be considered. The report said regular surveillance of mortality rates "has identified the epidemic problem in the early fall of 1980 and thus have led to corrective action."

In a prepared statement, hospital board chairman Don Gordon said he was "disappointed at the report's partial interpretation" without access to the full report.

McMurtry refused to release the full report because "to jeopardize the police investigation. Furthermore, publication of the report as a whole might be unfair to those referred to directly and indirectly."

He added the report contains analysis, comments and observations about the case of certain personnel at the hospital that may or may not be admissible in any future criminal or other proceedings.
