Holland and Jones were both Dr. Kathleen Holland and named in a wrongful death lawsuit filed by the father of 15month-old Chelsa Ann McClellan, who reportedly died after receiving medical care at Holland's Kerrville office on Sept.

Grand juries in both Bexar and Kerr counties are investigating the mysterious deaths of at least 12 infants in 1981 and 1982 at San Antonio's Medical Center Hospital, formerly called the Bexar County Hospital.

Holland and Jones were both employed at Medical Center Hospital between 1978 and

The Light, quoting an attorney close to the investigation, said other witnesses, including Medical Center Hospital's "top brass," have been "smuggled" into the grand jury room for the past two weeks.

The attorney said he suspected that the infants were iven excessive doses of hepar-

suceinycholine, a muscle relaxant, the Light reported. The infants reportedly died of cardiac

arrest or respiratory failure.
"We have been told that the hospital administrators were aware of the mysterious deaths among infants and, instead of taking action, attempted to cover the whole thing up," the attor-

ney said. However, hospital officials

denied any wrongdoing.
"I do not personally believe there was any wrongdoing," said Dr. B.H. Corum, executive director of the Bexar County Hos-pital District. "They (citizens) need to understand we are a good institution and we're getting better. We hope whatever

the truth is, it comes out." William Reid McClellan, who filed the Kerrville lawsuit, said his daughter died from seizures as she was being transported to San Antonio by the Kerr County

Medical Service.
