with the state of Arizona," he Plankinton said he hopes to sell the British cruise ship Shacelton, which he was buying

for his brothel-casino. "I just want to get my money back. That's what they really want - our money," Plankinton said

Arizona officials have been investigating the legality of the proposed floating brothel, but Plankinton accuses state officials of overzealous prosecution. Plankinton, who once owned

the Chicken Ranch brothel in Nye County, Nev., argues the cruise ship brothel would have been legal because it would have operated outside the jurisdic-tion of both state and federal au-

and hostesses Despite Plankinton's intentions to drop the idea, Deputy Maricopa County Attorney Jim Keppel said his office would continue its investigation of Plankinton's planned business venture


"He's trying to assert his mor-al standards on the rest of us,"


