## Signs limited for campaigns

In March, the Texas A&M campus won't be cluttered with campaign signs from every candidate, a Student Government election official says.

Les C. Asel, election commissioner, said Thursday that candidates with a campaign budget will be permitted to display signs in designated areas. Those offices are student body president, legislative vice presidents, yell leaders, resident hall advisers, off-campus Aggie president and class presidents.

All other candidates will only be allowed to display flyers, Asel said.

He said there has been a problem in the past with signs cluttering the campus. Candidates without a budget have used material less expensive than wood to build their signs. The wind blows away most of the cheaper signs and makes a mess, he said.

The filing period for interested candidates is from 9 a.m. Mar. 7 to 7 p.m. Mar. 11. Filing tables will be set up in the

main hall of the Memorial Student Center.

All candidates are scheduled to meet Mar. 20 in 701 Rudder to discuss campaign rules, Asel said. Campaigning will officially begin at 10 p.m. after the meeting.

On Mar. 23, an election rally will be held at Rudder fountain. Tables will be set up so candidates can speak with students who may have questions concerning the campaigns.

A debate between the presidential candidates will be Mar. 29 and 30. Voting stations will be set up at: the Academic and Agency Building, Zachry Engineering Center, Sterling C. Evans Library, Academic Building, Kleberg Animal and Food Science Center, Memorial Student Center, Sbsa Dining Hall.

Stations will also be placed at the corner of Nagle and Lubbock streets in front of Heldenfels Hall and the shuttle bus stop on the corner of Throckmorton Street and Joe Rountt Blvd.

## Chem students given awards

Two groups of Texas A&M chemistry students were recognized for outstanding research papers Friday at the Second Annual TAMU Undergraduate Chemical Research Conference and High School Conference on Chemistry.

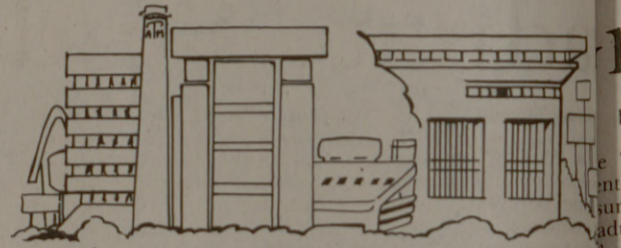
The undergraduate students competed against 21 other teams from ten colleges and universities for six \$50 cash prizes. The prizes were awarded by the Chemistry Club.

Other schools with winning teams are Tarleton State University, Baylor University and Lamar University.
