Horns sweep; Hogs beat Rice

AUSTIN — Texas pitcher Mike Capel hurled a one-hit shutout in the nightcap of a double-header Sunday and the Texas Longhorns swept Texas Wesleyan, 4-3 and 7-0.

Lewis hopes UH 'improves'

HOUSTON — There are certain aspects in which coaches Guy Lewis and Rollie Massimino would like to see improvement in their teams before they embark on their next assignments in the NCAA tournament.

Massimino would like to see a little more poise from his Villanova Wildcats at the end of the game and Lewis would dearly love to see a sharp improvement in his Houston Cougars' free throw shooting.

It does not take much of a tumble at this stage of the season to wind up on the sidelines and both the top-ranked Cougars and 11th-rated Wildcats survived into the Midwest regional semifinals despite some weaknesses showing up in their play last Saturday.

Such lapses could well be readily when they play next Friday night in Kansas City.

Houston, winners of 23 in a row and a 60-50 victor over Maryland at The Summit on Saturday, will take on Memphis in the semifinals while Villanova, which survived a late scare to down Lamar 60-58, will face the Iowa Hawkeyes.

In their Southwest Conference tournament championship win over TCU, the Cougars hit only eight of 22 free throws and missed the front end of seven one-and-one opportunities down the stretch to almost blow what had been a comfortable lead.

And although Maryland came no closer than seven points in the late going on Saturday, Houston could make good on just 14 of 29 free throw chances.

"But look at it this way," said Houston's Larry Micheaux. "We're getting to shoot all those free throws because we're 10 or 12 points ahead. As long as that's happening, we're going to be all right."

Micheaux missed four of five free throw chances and seven-foot center Akeem Olajuwon failed on all four of his opportunities from the line.

Villanova, meanwhile, let a 15-point lead dwindle to two in the final seven minutes and was barely hanging on at the end.

The Wildcats came into the tournament with three losses out of their last four games and were in need of a morale boosting win to enhance their chances of moving on to the Final Four.

Despite the narrowness of the decision, Massimino felt the win filled the bill.

"We had lost a little bit of confidence in our last few games," said the Villanova coach. "But we got over this hump. I think we completely controlled the tempo of the game. That was our objective."

The Wildcats are making their fourth straight trip to the NCAA tournament and this is

the second year in a row they have made it as far as the regional semifinals.

Last year Villanova defeated Memphis State in the East Regional semifinals before falling in the regional title game to eventual NCAA champion North Carolina. Houston is looking for its fourth Final Four trip and its second straight, having made it to New Orleans last year only to lose to North Carolina in the semifinals.

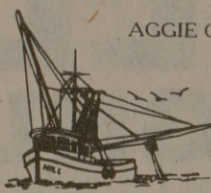
