Bill to counter fake card scam

United Press International WASHINGTON — The Senate, pushing toward passage of a \$165 billion Social Security system rescue bill today, voted to require that Social Security number cards be printed on banknote paper to foil counterfeiting.

As the Senate began its sixth day of debate, Republican leader Howard Baker predicted approval of a compromise proposal to delay mandatory coverage of new federal workers. That would deflate an expected controversy.

On a voice vote, the Senate agreed to an amendment by Sen. Daniel Moynihan, D-N.Y., that new or replacement cards be printed on banknote paper beginning six months after the bill's enactment.

Moynihan said fake Social Security cards can be bought on street corners in most parts of entry to the United States, and can help illegal aliens obtain jobs

or government aid, said identification in the nation \$15 billion in costs of tampering would be modest.

The House passed the bill contains no provision. The Social Security Administration said last week to begin printing new counterfeit-resistant cards has not yet begun design.

In addition to counterfeiting, the bill tends federal unemployment benefits, due to run 31, through Sept. 30, up to eight additional months for those who have exhausted benefits.


