## Bill allows policemen's use of pen registers

AUSTIN — District attorneys and state police officers will be allowed to use pen registers — devices used to record telephone numbers dialed from a phone — in an amended version of a bill controlling their use.

Sen. Oscar Mauzy, D-Dallas, originally offered legislation that would have required police officers to adhere to the same legal demands for use of a pen register as are required for the use of a telephone wiretap.

"With one simple addition a tape recorder can be plugged into that device (the pen regis-

ter), and every word you say is recorded."

But an amendment by Sen. John Montford, D-Lubbock, which makes it easier for the Department of Public Safety or a district attorney to use a pen register won approval on the Senate floor Wednesday.

Under Montford's amendment, pen registers could be used for investigating any offense. Only elected district attorneys and the director of the DPS could apply for a pen register permit.

Mauzy proposed that only the nine judges given power to

grant wiretaps would be able to grant the permits. He also wanted the use of pen registers confined to drug cases where there was probable cause that a crime already had been committed.

The U.S. Supreme Court has ruled registers do not constitute an invasion of privacy.

His amendment specified that any district court judge could grant permission to use a pen register when the information gained through the register would be material to an investigation and as long as it was to be used within his jurisdiction.

## Driver hits house, kills one in possible suicide attempt

SAN ANTONIO — A drunken driver, in an apparent suicide attempt, lost control of her car on a rain-slicked freeway and crashed into a house, killing a nine-month-old infant sleeping in the bedroom, police said.

The car was traveling at a high rate of speed at about 10 p.m. Wednesday when it ran off Interstate 10, went through a

chain link fence and struck the house, just off the access road about 50 yards from the highway.

A police spokesman said the driver, Cleo Longoria, 35, was incoherent after the crash and said she was trying to commit suicide.

"She made a statement along those lines, but we don't have anything else yet," the spokes-

man said.

Longoria, who received minor injuries, was charged with driving while intoxicated and involuntary manslaughter. Her bond was set at \$10,000.

Pierre Orlanda Garza was dead on arrival at Medical Center Hospital. His mother, Alicia Garza, was listed in stable condi-

## EPA funding use discussed

# White comments on GOPEA

AUSTIN — Responding to reports that the Republican Party tried to use Environmental Protection Agency funds to influence the Texas governor's race, Gov. Mark White said he never knew he was taking on the entire Republican establishment.

White was asked to comment on reports that a White House aide discussed timing the issuance of EPA Superfund grants to boost the campaigns of several Republican candidates, including former Gov. Bill Clements.

"I just thought I was running against one Republican," White

said in a news conference Wednesday. "I didn't know I was running against the entire Republican establishment. That should never be condoned by any administration."

Clements has said he knew nothing of the alleged plan to politicize the EPA funding.

"That's what I would have said," White remarked about the Clements denial. "They're (the EPA) playing games in several areas up there. I want to see the hazardous waste funds coming to Texas."

"It seems they were very effectively flowing those funds down here before November," White said.

On other issues, White emphasized his total commitment to making the Public Utility Commission an elected body, promised job aid to the Rio Grande Valley and defended his plan for funding highway construction.

White said elected commissioners would be more accountable to the public.

"I am extremely serious about having an elected commission," White said. "There is nothing better than an elected PUC that gets up with a tight stomach every morning trying to figure out how to do a better job every day."

White said highway construction funding would be one of several areas in which the state

would work to ease the employment crisis in the Rio Grande Valley brought by Mexico's devaluation of the peso.

He said the state's job training programs would be geared to aid the Rio Grande Valley area.

White rejected claims by the Comptroller, Bob Bullock, that his proposal to finance highway construction through the issuance of general obligation bonds amounted to "style financing" and would leave the state with an unmanageable debt.

"It's pay-as-you-go financing," White said.

## Affair was motive for oilman's killing

AMARILLO — A former police captain shot an Amarillo oilman because he saw the man and his wife making love in the back of a pickup, the former policeman's attorneys told prospective jury members.

It was only later that former policeman L.R. Wynne learned the affair had been going on for 22 years, one attorney said.

Speaking to a panel of prospective jury members, attorney Travis Shelton of Lubbock said L. R. Wynne had followed his wife and Erle Winston Mathis, 63, on Oct. 15, 1982, and watched them make love in Mathis'

pickup parked on a road.

An hour later an investigating Wynne jumped from his patrol car and fired five .38-caliber bullets through Mathis' window, killing the oilman, Shelton said.

Janeen Williams, who was near the shooting, said she remembered Wynne getting out of his car.

"His face was very red, his teeth were clenched as if in a mad rage," she said.

William White said he swerved his car in front of Mathis' car and stopped it at moments before the shooting.

"I mumbled something, my breath," Williams said. "I saw him get out of the car. I thought I had done something wrong thing."
