In several ways, the outfit is easily distinguishable from other outfits. There are three women in the formation, some V-1 cadets wear decorations from prior military service and some are in their middle and late twenties.

Ogura says most V-1 cadets are in the Corps to seek military commissions — a fact of which the outfit is proud. All juniors

and seniors in the outfit currently hold contracts leading toward military commissions.

Ogura says that since he has been in the Corps, only one cadet in V-1 hasn't accepted a commission.

Company V-1 started recruiting in local high schools to attract more high school seniors who would like to join the Corps and live at home. This year the outfit has four freshmen.

"An outfit is basically centered around its freshmen," Ogura says. He says he thinks more freshmen cadets in V-1 will facilitate more participation in the outfit as they become upperclassmen.

"We've come a long way since I've been in the Corps," he says. "When I first joined we had a problem with seniors not caring about traditions."

Ogura says he would like

more civilians who have served in the military to join the outfit.

Many students do not know that there is an off-campus outfit.

Bonanno pleads 'honor'

GOLD HILL, Ore. — A handwritten sign on the door of City Hall reads: "Closed until further notice."

The terse notice doesn't say that political infighting has left

him in jail for half a century, claims he is a "man of honor" who has merely been misunderstood all his life.

Bonanno said the Mafia itself, really a "beautiful symbol of my tradition," has been misunderstood also.

Bonanno, 78, was interviewed by Mike Wallace on CBS-TV Network's "60 Minutes" program aired Sunday.

"I believe with a sense of integrity, I was born a man of honor. I was the most respected man in New York and all over the country," Bonanno said. "I just run my family as a father."

Bonanno said he never has been involved in three illegal activities authorities say are the lifeblood of the Mafia — prostitution, drugs and contract killings.

Bonanno said he remembers his father telling him "there's three things that just don't happen."

"And one is women, living off women, meaning prostitution, where a woman supports you. Two is dealing in narcotics," Bonanno said. "And the third is hurting anybody for money."

Wallace also read from a New York police profile of the

Bonanno family which Bonanno tried to arrange the deaths of three other Mafia leaders — Carlo Gambino, Frank Lucchese and Stefano Magaddino.

While Bonanno has been in jail for more than 50 years, luck may be running out. He was convicted two years ago for conspiring with a witness and a spy to obstruct justice.

The Supreme Court turned down his appeal. Bonanno is expected to be serving a five-year prison term later this spring.

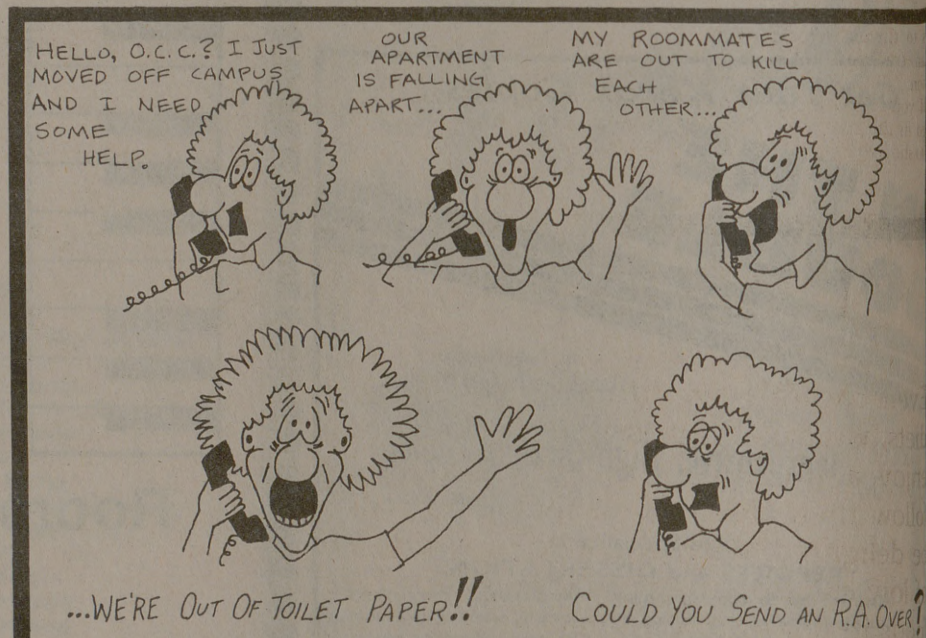
