## Dallas to go Warped MADD come July

**DALLAS** — Mothers Against Drunk Drivers will move its national headquarters from California to Dallas to take advantage of easier nationwide transportation, the organization announced Tuesday.

Candy Lightner, who founded the organization in 1981 after her daughter was killed by a drunk driver, said the board of directors last week approved the move from Fair Oaks, Calif.

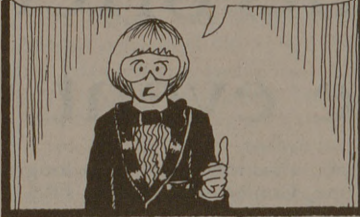
"I checked the Dallas airport and the longest I'll be in the air (visiting local chapters) is 2.7 hours," Lightner said. "Part of my problem now is that it takes me a day to travel."

She said the non-profit group, which has 70,000 members, hopes to make the move by July. It is searching for a company in the Dallas area to donate office space for the headquarters and eight full-time employees.

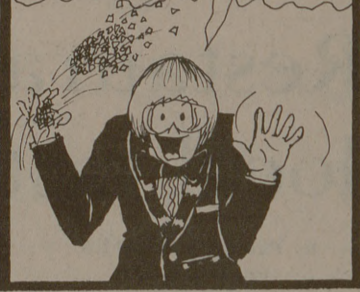
Lightner said other cities considered were Denver, Kansas City and St. Louis.

MADD has 122 chapters in 22 states. It proposes DWI legislation and assists victims of accidents involving drunken drivers.

## Boy suspended for earring

**PASADENA** — The Pasadena Independent School District Board upheld the suspension of a 15-year-old high school boy for wearing an earring.

Troy Erickson was suspended from Dobie High School March 14 for refusing to remove an earring from his left ear lobe. The school board voted

unanimously Tuesday that the teenager could not return to school until he removes the jewelry.

Erikson's stepfather, Bill Gurley, said he was not surprised at the school board's action. He said his next step was to take the matter to court.

Gurley said neither the dress

code nor the handbook of the school district prohibits boys from wearing earrings to school and he feels his stepson's civil rights have been violated.

Gurley, an insurance salesman in the Houston suburb, said school officials told him they opposed the boy's earring because men who wear earrings

are either drug addicts or gay. "Troy's civil rights have been violated and I can't go for that. I'm not going to let it sit still now. We knew exactly what the school district would decide before we got there. The next step will be in a courtroom and I will take all the way to the Supreme Court if necessary," Gurley said Tuesday night.

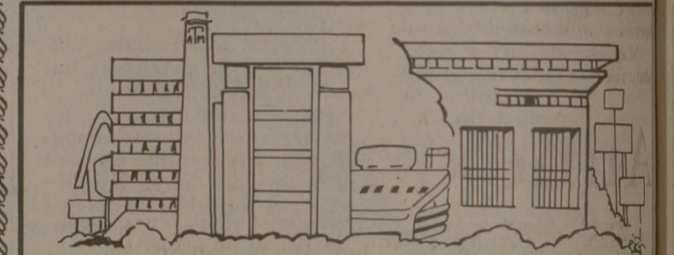

Approximately 1500 rainbow trout will be delivered between 9 a.m. and 10 a.m. on Thursday. The trout will be placed in Adamson Pool at Bee Creek Park and fishing will be opened to the public Friday.

Fees for this weekend's fishing event are 75 cents for children under 12 and \$1 for adults, plus \$2 a fish. Prizes awarded for catching tagged fish include: two summer passes worth \$100 each, five discount passes worth \$14 each and 10 free swimming passes.

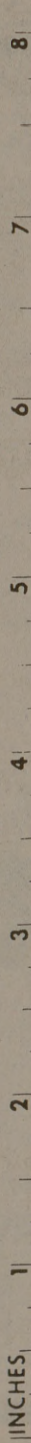
