## Volcano cloud blocks sun

WASHINGTON — A massive volcanic cloud is blocking as much as one-fifth of the sun's energy that would be available to the solar collector systems on these days, U.S. government scientists report.

The volcanic cloud now circulating the Earth's mid-latitudes is caused by last year's eruption of the El Chichon Volcano in Mexico, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration said Thursday.

Solar energy systems with concentrating collectors that focus on the sun's direct-beam radiation during cloudless conditions are affected by the cloud, said.

Since late October, "Direct solar radiation arriving at the Earth's surface from the Sun without interference has been reduced by as much as 15 to 20 percent, compared to similar conditions of earlier years," the

agency said.

But researchers, Kirby Hanson and Edwin Flowers, reported that at the same time, "sunlight scattered downward to the Earth's surface has increased.

"The net effect is that solar radiation collected by flat-plate collectors has decreased very little from earlier years," they said. Flat-plate collectors gather both direct and scattered sunlight arriving at the Earth's surface.

In the Western Hemisphere, the volcanic cloud extends somewhat north of the Canadian-U.S. border, and as far south as southern Argentina and Chile.

Particles from El Chichon have spread much farther and are having a greater effect on solar radiation than did pollution from the Mount St. Helens volcanic eruption, the agency said.

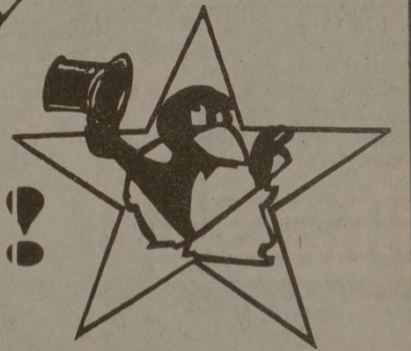
"With Mount St. Helens, the particles were at a lower altitude and got rained out more easily," agency spokesman William Brennan said.

"The El Chichon particles were blasted up so high from the eruption that they were above where there would be a cleansing," he said.
