## Nuclear plant cited by NRC

**DALLAS** — The Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff cited the owners of the controversial Comanche Peak Nuclear Power Plant for failing to clean metal filings from the insides of light poles installed in the reactor core.  
Safety inspector Arvill Dillingham, Jr., told the staff an impatient supervisor had kept him from cleaning the six light poles before installation.  
Dillingham said metal shavings could wash out of the tubular poles during refueling and cling to the fuel rods, causing a meltdown.  
Plant owner Texas Utilities Generating Co. and the NRC staff said the poles were too far away from the fuel core to cause any such danger.  
But the NRC report did say the poles should have been inspected before installation.  
TUGCA spokesman Vega said the poles were moved and cleaned after Dillingham made his charge.  
A report prepared by NRC, and released to the public last year by the United States Nuclear Concerned Scientists, said the reactor meltdown at the plant could kill as many as 100,000 people.  
This March, the Comanche Peak to improve reactor control — charging that 90 percent of the parts from the plant were defective. The report was the fourth in a series of warnings by the agency, which criticized Utilities for weaknesses in its weld-inspection program.

## Man indicted in reward theft

**HOUSTON** — The former director of a department store reward fund, set up to pay citizens or employees who help get stolen merchandise returned, has been charged with stealing more than \$50,000 from the fund.  
Carl Onofrietti, 45, who worked at Foley's Department Store, was indicted Wednesday on one count of theft and one count of misapplication of funds.  
Assistant District Attorney Mel Pechacek said as director of loss prevention, Onofrietti was responsible for paying rewards for the recovery of stolen merchandise in Foley's stores in Houston, San Antonio and Austin. He was employed by the store for four years.  
The return of a \$12,000 check cashed by Onofrietti in September 1982 ended his access to the reward fund, Pechacek said. The check was made out to Onofrietti and deposited in a New York bank account the same day he was paid \$15,000 check to a Las Vegas casino.  
Pechacek said Onofrietti wrote himself more than a dozen checks, ranging from \$515 to \$11,000.  
Pechacek said when Onofrietti from the store asked for an accounting of the fund, Onofrietti said he did not keep records of rewards paid.

## Sodomy decision upheld

**AUSTIN** — Although attorneys said Attorney General Mattox was "morally wrong" to refuse to appeal a federal ruling overturning the state's sodomy law, the state Supreme Court has ruled that would force Mattox to appeal the ruling.  
The high court ruled Wednesday that Mattox within his rights as attorney general to refuse to appeal a ruling by U.S. District Judge R. Buchmeyer of Dallas, which declared the state's sodomy law unconstitutional.  
Rep. Bill Ceverha, Richardson, and Sen. John R. Dallas, had joined the district attorney of Potter County in seeking a Supreme Court order that would force Mattox to appeal the ruling.  
Ceverha said he was appointed by the court's decision, saying Mattox's refusal to appeal could open the door every little group that would seek to destroy the fabric of society.
