Boxer claims innocence in rape charge trial

PATERSON — Boxer Tony Ayala Jr., testifying in his own defense on charges he raped a West Paterson woman at knife-point, says he "didn't force her to do anything she didn't want to do."

Ayala is charged with breaking into the apartment of the 30-year-old former math teacher and forcing her to have sexual

relations at knife-point. He also is accused of threatening the woman's 29-year-old roommate with the same knife.

Ayala, an undefeated junior middleweight contender, told the Passaic County Superior Court jury that sometime during the early morning hours of New Year's Day, he was walking to his car to get cigarettes and noticed lights on in the woman's apartment.

He testified that he never had sexual relations with the woman's roommate, but she had ever tied up a woman. "No" and "I would have" Ayala said he then pulled up his socks. At that point, he suggested acts of sodomy, but he refused to perform. "I didn't force her to do anything she didn't want to do," Ayala said.

Elderly garbage digger dies leaves church \$250,000

SHREVEPORT, La. — An elderly woman often seen scavenging in garbage cans willed at least \$250,000 to a church, but her body is unclaimed in the

parish morgue. Margaret Siders, 92, was found dead March 31 in her home, a ramshackle tin building perched on the banks of the Red River in northwest Louisiana. Her body was still in the Caddo Parish morgue Monday.

In the 1970s, Siders and her husband, Herbert, were embroiled in a controversy with city officials who tried to remove them from a squatter's shack on

Cross Bayou. When the shack burned, police found the couple's mattress. The Siders later moved to a building, and Herbert was killed in a fire in 1977. Siders for weeks walked the downtown well pulling a wagon and begging for false teeth carved in wood and eyeglasses. No one knows where the money came from, and friends say Siders was an Army officer or a road worker. Siders' death was reported in the Missions Division of the Pentecostal Church.

Abducted girl, 4, escapes

MIAMI — In the 15th hour she was found — a dirty and wandering street — a 4-year-old blue-eyed girl won the Miami.
