Supreme Court sets up date for hearing on windfall tax

CHEYENNE, Wyo. — The U.S. Supreme Court has agreed to hear arguments April 27 on the federal government's appeal of U.S. District Judge Ewing T. Kerr's ruling in November that the windfall profits tax is unconstitutional.

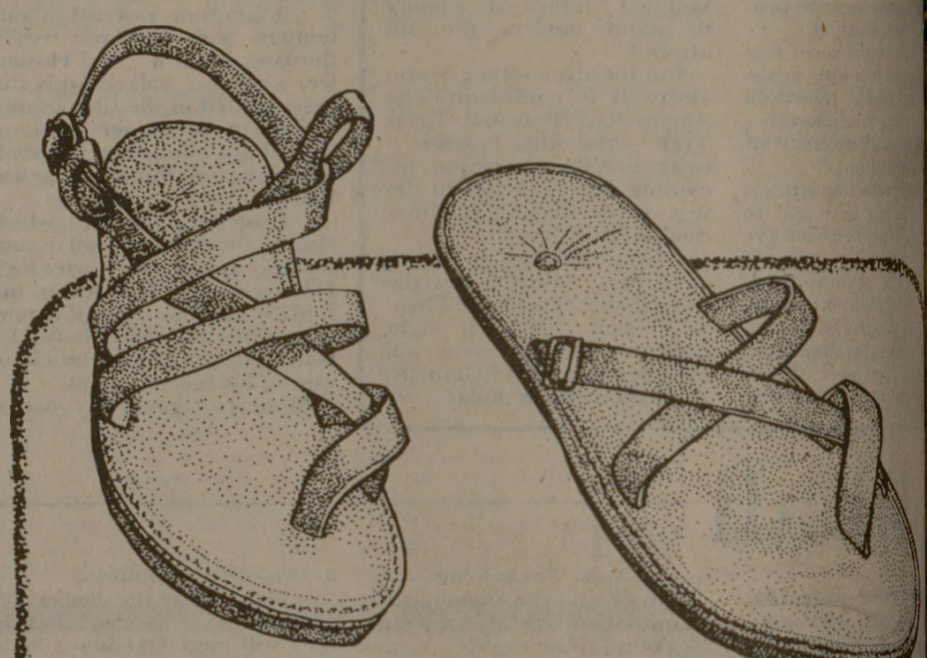
In January, the court had rejected the justice department's request for expedited consideration of the appeal and in February had agreed to consider the case under usual procedures.

That would have meant the arguments would have been heard next term and the ruling would probably be handed down next year.

But court officials told a Cheyenne newspaper Monday that the justices have reversed themselves and will speed up the case, hearing arguments 27.

The government had to have the case expedited because it stands to lose large amounts of revenue if the tax is struck down.

Kerr ruled the tax unconstitutional because an increase for oil produced in violation of the provision must be applied uniformly.
