Eviction ends protest vigil

DALLAS — Thirty Reagan administration demonstrators were evicted Monday from a downtown Dallas bomb shelter, despite preparations to stay a year or more and bring their families into a protest vigil.

Rabbis want nuclear freeze

DALLAS — An influential body of Jewish leaders has called on the Reagan Administration to halt shipment of nuclear technology abroad and to freeze the arms buildup.

Americans must "stand firm in their resolve that a nuclear freeze be imposed on the manufacture of these lethal weapons," Rabbi Robert Gordis said. Gordis was the keynote speaker Monday at the 83rd Annual

Rabbinical Assembly Convention here. The assembly represents 1.5 million Jews. Gordis said Reagan Administration officials were "attempting to spoon-feed the American people the nonsense that a nuclear war is thinkable and winnable."

greatest moral crisis in the history of western civilization. Gordis said, "and the migration of human beings in the nuclear arms race is a threat of nuclear annihilation." The resolution, originally approved by the Conservative Rabbis, urged the United States and Soviet Union "to implement a bilateral and verifiable total reduction in the production and deployment of nuclear weapons."

House passes remapping bill

AUSTIN — By a 91-41 vote, the House tentatively approved a redistricting plan adopted by a panel of federal judges for the 1982 elections.

The vote was hotly disputed by minority groups. The members approved a plan which follows the district lines drawn by the Legislative Redistricting Board with the exceptions of Bexar and El Paso Counties.

The sponsor of the redistricting bill, Tom Uher, D-Dallas, said members of the House, Compacts and the Committee tried and failed to redraw Dallas County lines to preserve Hispanic and voting strengths.

Braniff offered \$10 million aid

DALLAS — Hyatt Corp. is offering a \$10 million loan to put bankrupt Braniff International back into the skies, gaining in return a potential \$360 million tax advantage, analysts said.

Under the Chicago-based hotel chain's proposal, the bankrupt airline's creditors would be required to subsidize the company with as much as \$50 million by taking new notes for the amounts of money they are owed. Some creditors are reportedly balking at the proposed arrangement.

If the proposal is accepted, the hotel chain could get a tax break of \$360 million, the amount Braniff lost before it ceased operations May 12, 1982, the Dallas Times Herald reported today.
