Acid rain is created when sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxides combine with water vapor in the atmosphere. It is blamed for damage to lakes, streams, forests and man-made structures in eastern North America and parts of Europe

Environmentalists available evidence points strong-ly to sulfur emissions from coalburning power plants, especially in the Midwest United States, as the major cause of acid rain damage in the East.
