## Protestor gets job with Reagan's help

NEW YORK — The unemployed Pittsburgh steelworker handed his resume to President Reagan as a "gesture" representing the desperation of the unemployed accepted a job on Wednesday.

and Reagan's setting up the Tandy Corp. interview. Mrs. Bricker said her husband planned the action for two days.

Ron Bricker, 39, out of work a year, said he will go to work at Radio Shack even though his job will pay half of what he had to make.

The company interviewed the steelworker and administered a battery of computer and personality tests earlier this week and offered him the job of a service computer trainee on Wednesday.

Bricker talked about the presentation in an interview on ABC's "Good Morning America," with his wife, Marjorie, and Stephen Nohowel, a Radio Shack regional manager. "I was nervous, but I was going to represent all the millions of people out of work," Bricker said. "It was a gesture to show how desperate we all are." Nohowel said the job offered Bricker was not created to reward his boldness but was available before the highly publicized presentation of Bricker's action.

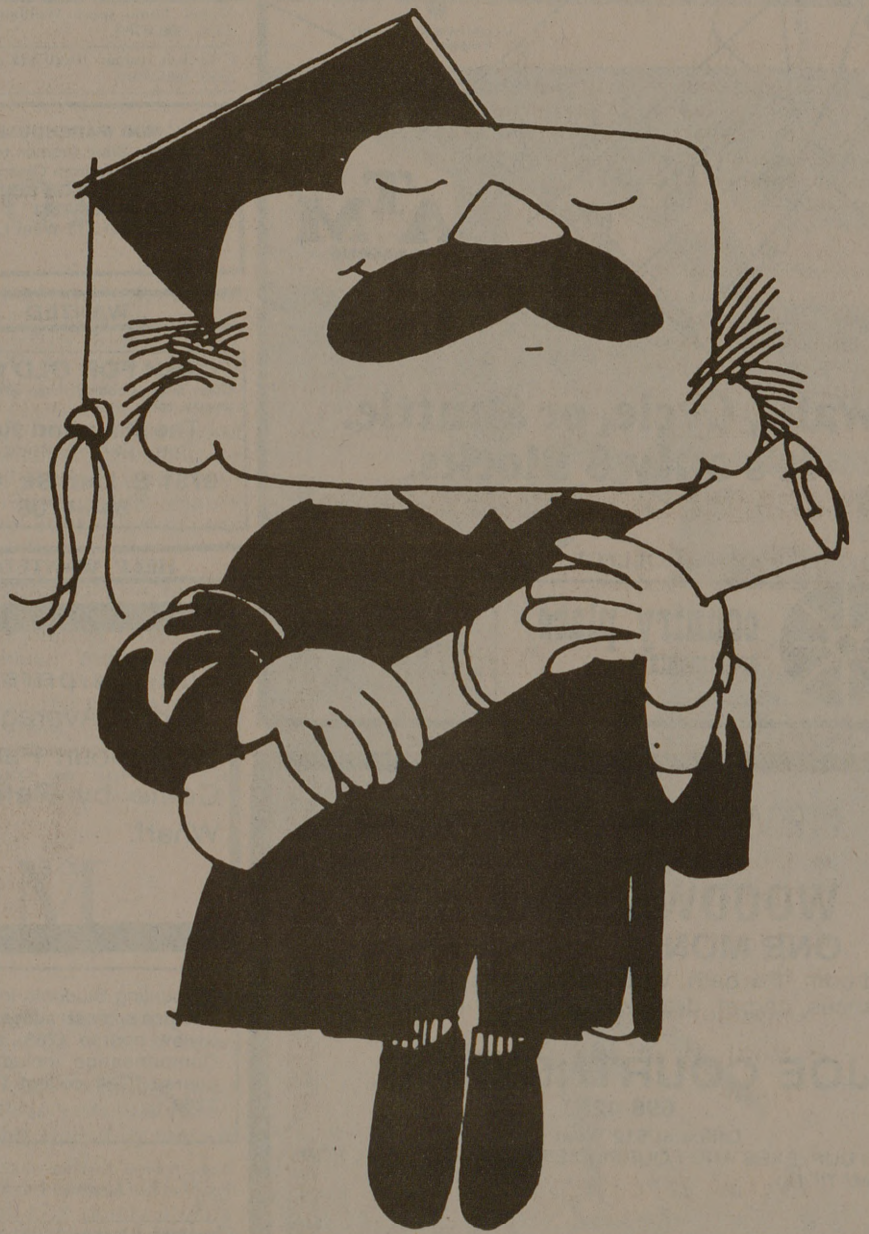
