we'll stop recruiting," he said.

The number of students needed is decided by individual departments, Ivins said. Although the agricultural program is the largest, it may have more need for students than the smallest program.

University President Frank E. Vandiver, during a recent Texas A&M Board of Regents meeting, said the "graduate school leaves a little to be desired." When asked about the comment, Vandiver said the University lacks in the number of students and the funds to recruit more of them.

Ivins is the only person recruiting graduate students and has no secretary to handle the paperwork in his office.

No funds were set aside for recruiting when the office was established. The Graduate College budgeted money for one person to do the job and has budgeted funds for a secretary for next year. The minority committee report recommended hiring two more recruiters, specifically for minority students, and several secretaries. If the recommendation is approved, funds will be available to hire those people.

The Association of Former Students also contributes to recruiting, he said. It is against the law to use state money to travel outside Texas for recruiting purposes, Ivins said, so a fund was created that uses former students' money. Departments pay

for representatives to trips, but the Graduate is responsible for all other trips.

Texas A&M has a program against recruiting graduates from schools that have the same graduate program as supported schools, according to the number of students in the program said, and the schools are not to receive money if students are recruited away from the schools.

On the other hand, private colleges often recruit their students to graduate schools without doing so.

"We have no problem on any campus, but we do create ill feelings by recruiting for programs the other schools do not have," Ivins said.

While the graduates are growing in quantity, Ivins also attributes the improvement to the personal touch of recruiting visits to schools.

Ivins said the average scores for incoming students has risen tremendously the last year — by 20 points.

"A&M's reputation is by leaps and bounds in academic areas," he said. "More and more people are coming here because of our good reputation."

Asel said, however, that the poll was not in the Quad, but on the street running in front of the Quad, across from Heldenfels, consequently, Commons residents and cadets had equal access.

But Asel agreed that polls at the library and the MSC bus stop should have been open. In fact, all nine of the originally planned polls should have been open, he said, but only five were open because of a lack of student volunteers to staff the polls.

But King disagreed. "He's got 500 people in Student Government," King said. "You'd think he could tap into that."

Student Body President Pat Pearson said, however, that most of the people active in Student Government either were running for office or helping someone else run for office, and automatically were disqualified. McCaskill said he questioned

why Asel didn't ask some societies on campus to supply the workers.

Asel said that was a mistake on his part. He did ask the organizations in the run-offs, but they needed. Asel also questioned why organizations were not in the elections should help, when regulations that the institutions with election should supply workers.

Both Pearson and student body president said Asel did everything to prepare for the election, but said that he didn't show up for work.

Concerning tabulating election results and McCaskill said he had a sample prepared for any problem. He said he did run a sample and said it worked.

Pearson said that with computer program Asel's fault but one that Student Government did the majority of the work with the election was Asel's poor attitude.

"The first thing that is important is the poll. Les Asel had, King wouldn't even keep it. There was never that at least I'm going someone who was given neutral in the position commissioner. I'm the feeling I could not."

Asel said, "You can't up in two words — I know within me that I'm in some areas and others. Nobody's person never quit."

United Press International LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Heresy hearing in the teachings of a conservative seminary Thursday, Nov. 10, was averted, according to Lee Hoveycutt, the seminary's president.

The issue of apostasy, belief that a person who saved can fall from grace, recently will not be heard in this week's meeting of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary's board of trustees, which began Tuesday.

Most Baptists hold that saved, always saved.

But in his four years of teaching at the seminary, Hoveycutt has called that "Baptist heresy," and that it stems from a misunderstanding of Scripture in the Second London Confession of 1689.

Moody said the seminary's board of trustees, a list of beliefs, requires professors to be in accordance with "the primary" to "the absolute."
