Cocaine, alcohol involved

Former Cowboy arrested

DALLAS — Laboratory tests indicated that former Dallas Cowboys offensive lineman John Niland was carrying cocaine at the time of his arrest on April 6, police said today. "It is cocaine," said police spokesman Bob Shaw. The white substance, analyzed by a laboratory, was in a vial

carried by Niland when he was stopped and arrested for suspicion of cocaine possession, drunken driving and three other charges, Shaw said.

Shaw said the formal drug-related charge would be violation of the controlled substances act — cocaine. Niland, 39, was arrested at

2:50 a.m. April 6 by police who said they stopped his car and observed bloodshot eyes, slurred speech and smelled alcohol on his breath. He spent seven hours in jail before being released.

Police also charged Niland with driving while intoxicated, and driving with an expired license, expired license plates

and an invalid vehicle inspection sticker.

Niland was released after his attorney posted a \$200 bond with the county to cover an unrelated misdemeanor theft charge.

Niland, a University of Iowa graduate, played for the Cowboys from 1966 to 1974.

Mental patient still gone

HOUSTON — A woman suspected of spiriting her paranoid-schizophrenic son from a state mental hospital has been ordered not to harbor the man or interfere with his guardianship.

Mirella Adelman said she had been keeping her son Daniel, 22, behind special barred doors in her home because he was beaten and sexually abused in state hospitals. Daniel was reported missing

from Austin State Hospital March 25 and a neighbor reported seeing him at Mrs. Adelman's house April 3. Mrs. Adelman took the Fifth Amendment in response to questions at a hearing Tuesday.

Authorities have been unable to locate the son.

Harris County Probate Judge Jim Scanlan said Daniel, diagnosed as a paranoid-schizophrenic, had been in five state hospitals and that Mrs.

Adelman, 48, who works as an exotic dancer, had complained of sex abuse in each one.

"If this is so, there are appropriate avenues for prosecution," the judge told her.

After the hearing Tuesday,

Scanlan issued an injunction forbidding Mrs. Adelman from hampering efforts to institutionalize her son, and Daniel's court-appointed guardian said he will seek a contempt citation if she does.

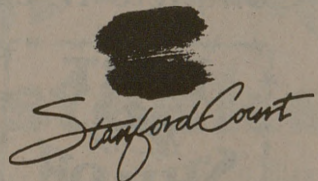
