Teachers salaries debated

AUSTIN—A House vote has voted to provide pay increases for public teachers in the next year.

despite Gov. Mark White's insistence that teachers' pay raise of nearly 20% be paid over a five-year period. The House Appropriations Committee voted last week to support only a 10% increase in salary authorized by previous law. A 10% vote means teachers would receive pay approximately 9 percent the 1984-1985 biennium.

However, committee man Rep. Bill Pressley said he hoped additional income would be made for teachers' salaries by a legislative committee that is in the state budget.

White made the increased teachers' salary focal point of his campaign to fight for further pay of approximately 20 percent.

White reaffirmed his commitment at a press conference held before the vote, saying he would urge the Legislature not to retreat from making education a top priority.

The Senate Finance Committee, whose members are supportive of a tax increase yet to take up teachers' salaries.

Before the vote on the line on further pay in the Appropriations Committee turned down a motion by Matt Garcia, D-San Antonio, to increase salaries by an estimated 17 percent over the biennium. Garcia's proposal has cost an estimated \$1 billion.

Trucking decontrol bills fail

AUSTIN—Supervisory regulation in the trucking industry say a bill passed by the legislature will do little to end the tradition of effectively blocking new businesses from the industry.

The bill, heralded by Speaker Gib Lewis as a promise between shippers, truckers, passed Wednesday with only six negative industry lobbyists watching a packed gallery.

The bill extends until the operation of the Texas road Commission, which regulates transportation, and surface mining. Most of the deregulation proposals failed to pass by more than 30 votes.

The only close vote was to move to deregulate the industry of agricultural production that effort also failed. A proposal to change the operation of the regulatory agency Energy and Communications Commission.

Sponsors of the bill softened the requirement for new trucking businesses by the industry without deregulation.

Current commission requires a new company to acquire three points in order to receive a trucking license that serves the public need that it was needed and that existing services adequate.

The bill would shield existing carriers that hold new business permits.

"This isn't going to ease entry into the industry," said Rep. Tom Stafford, the chief sponsor of the bill.

DeLay said it was possible for prospective carriers to counter an existing carrier's claim that it provided adequate service.
