"Market pressure on dealers cost them a big chunk of money," the newsletter said.

Recent margin losses by dealers and similar losses to independent sellers who did not pass on the entire tax increase cannot be sustained for long, Lundberg said.

Refining and marketing los-ses since last July amounted to about \$2.3 billion in the industry, the newsletter said. 'Candidates for survival will

be turning this around, if possible," Lundberg said.

Gasoline demand is stronger this year than last and "sparks of economic recovery are promp-ting analysts to expect a better balance between supply and demand," Lundberg said.

The newsletter said members of the Organization of Pet-roleum Exporting Countries appear to be adhering to price and production agreements and non-OPEC producers are not undercutting OPEC prices.
