'Neglect' hurts farm agency

WASHINGTON — Rural congressmen blame years of indifference for the weakening of the Farmers Home Administration — the Agriculture Department agency that lends money to farmers unable to obtain credit elsewhere.

A 16-page report by the Congressional Rural Caucus says neglect has forced the agency to operate under policies that are unable to improve the weak farm economy.

"The Farmers Home Administration has been subjected to years of indifference by the Executive Branch in its recommendations to the Congress," the report says.

"The Department of Agriculture has been part and parcel of this indifference, orchestrated by an Office of Management and Budget which has exercised the foresight of the so-called Modoc bird, not looking ahead, but where it has been."

In its report, the Democratic-controlled caucus criticizes the Reagan administration for failing to implement existing rural development laws in the manner Congress intended to have them implemented. Instead, the caucus says, the administration has tried to "curtail, decrease and terminate workable programs."

The report singles out recent administration budget proposals that recommend consolidating existing Farmers Home Administration rural housing grants, subsidies and other programs into a single rural housing block grant program to the states for complaint.

The document also criticizes another block grant proposal, which calls for consolidation of the Farmers Home Administration community facilities and waste disposal loans.

The transfer of those programs to the states would result to "the systematic demise of Farmers Home Administration programs and services," the report says.

"There are only two federal entities which have the semblance of a delivery system to rural America: the Home Administration and the Community Development Administration," the report says.

"Russia, Poland, South Africa, Lybia and many other nations have places on the map in the United States," the report adds.

The caucus recommends specific changes in existing cultural and rural development laws.

Instead, it calls for increased support from both the administration and Congress for laws, which it describes as "more than adequate to maintain strength and integrity of America."

STRIKING RAILROAD IS ROLLING

NEW YORK — Metro-North commuter trains had the green light to roll for the first time in six weeks after an agreement was reached to end a rail strike that forced 90,000 daily riders into car pools and buses.

The railroad said riders on the first day of operation would be on the house.

The initial run on the New Haven line was followed by a resumption of service on the Harlem and Hudson lines.

Word the strike was over received enthusiastically by commuters and trainmen.

"I love it," said a conductor. "The Hudson line when it began to roll was a sight to behold. It was a relief to see the trains rolling again."

The end of the strike was announced during two back-to-back news conferences held by United Transportation Union and Metropolitan Transportation Authority officials at the MTA's Manhattan headquarters Sunday night. The MTA runs Metro-North.

"We are pleased to announce an end to the strike on Metro-North. We're pulling our pants and getting the trains rolling," UTU General Chairman Liam Beebe said.

MTA Chairman Richard Ravitch said he felt the MTA had achieved its prime objective during the strike — not giving to the union on the issue of determining crew size.

But, he added, "Strikes are never helpful. Nobody ever gained anything from this."

Labor lawyer Theodore Kheel, an unpaid union advisor said under the terms of the settlement both sides will return to the bargaining table for 45 days while they prepare their case for the arbitrators.

The two sides will have 45 days to present their cases, which the panel will have 45 days to issue its decision.

He said the arbitrators approve a three-year contract thus eliminating the chance of another strike until at least 1986.

The end of the strike followed after each side individually filed the arbitration plan.

UTU members followed recommendation of UTU General Chairman Richard Beebe and voted 159 to 28 in favor of arbitration.

A day earlier union officials representing New Haven employees held a similar vote.
