Texarkana gets grant for sewer

United Press International LITTLE ROCK, Ark. — The Environmental Protection Agency awarded the border city of Texarkana a \$22.6 million grant to construct a new sewer system, Rep. Beryl Anthony Jr., D-Ark., announced Thursday.

The sewer project is a joint venture of the Arkansas and Texas cities that compose Texarkana. The plant is being built on south State Line Avenue, the dividing line between the border

Anthony said from Washington Thursday the project in-cludes construction of a new waste water treatment plant and rehabilitation of sewer lines.

Texarkana, Ark., city mana-ger Ken Parker said the two cities will begin issuing \$7.9 mil-lion in bonds Monday to finance the local share of the project.


