Notice dates: Commons will be open for cash business on Registration day, May 30. Meal plans will begin on the first day of class, May 31.

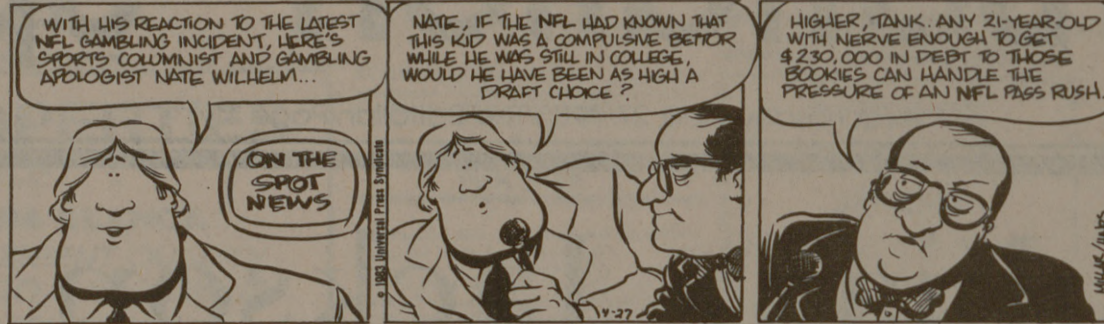

## Pirates down San Francisco; Astros shut out Expos, 2-0

Larry McWilliams allowed one hit Tuesday night.

But that hit, a one-out single by Brenly in the fifth inning led the Pittsburgh Pirates to a 3-0 victory over the San Francisco Giants.

Johnny Ray hit a solo homer and Bill Madlock added a two-run double to back McWilliams, 2-2, who walked five and struck out eight.

Brenly called his hit a "99 bouncer up the middle," and McWilliams at first thought he could have had it. He later changed his mind.

"It was just wishful thinking," said the hurler. "The ball was to my right and I was falling off the mound to the left, so I couldn't have got it."

The lefthander benefited from strong defense, with the Pirates turning three double plays and Lee Lacy and Dale Berra each making superior plays to prevent hits.

"The guys played super defense," said McWilliams. "I had to have it tonight—I walked five guys. I would have been in trouble without it."

Madlock doubled in Lacy and Lee Mazzilli with one out in the third, off loser Fred Breining, to

give the Pirates a 2-0 lead. Ray made it 3-0 with one out in the sixth when he lofted a 2-2 pitch over the right field wall for his first homer of the season.

In other games, San Diego overpowered the Chicago Cubs, 10-8, Houston blanked Montreal, 2-0, Cincinnati clubbed New York, 7-0, Atlanta downed Philadelphia, 10-4, and St. Louis defeated Los Angeles, 3-1.

In the American League, it was: Cleveland 7, Minnesota 1; Milwaukee 4, Chicago 3; Kansas City 10, New York 4; Texas 2, Toronto 1; Seattle 7, Boston 6; and Oakland 4, Baltimore 3.

At Chicago, Steve Garvey blasted a two-run homer in the top of the seventh inning and Terry Kennedy followed with a solo shot to lead San Diego.

At Montreal, Bob Knepper pitched a four-hitter, while Jose Cruz hit a solo home run and Dickie Thon drove in a first-inning run with a sacrifice fly for the Astros.

## Spurs outscore Denver, 152-133

If Tuesday night was as cold as Ice gets, the heat's on the Denver Nuggets.

"When Ice is playing like he was tonight there is really nothing you can do," Denver guard T.R. Dunn said, after George Gervin shot 17-of-22 en route to 42 points in leading the San Antonio Spurs to a 152-133 Western Conference semifinal victory over the Nuggets in the highest-scoring playoff game in NBA history.

Game 2 will be played tonight in Texas before the series shifts to Denver.

The game broke three NBA playoff records, including most points by a team in a first half (82), most points by two teams in a first half (150), and most total game points by two teams (285).

The previous high was set on March 30, 1970—279 points in a game between Milwaukee and Philadelphia.

Gervin also grabbed 10 rebounds, while Johnny Moore scored 24 points and 17 assists while connecting on 11-of-16 from the floor.

Mike Mitchell and Gene Banks added 22 points each for San Antonio. Banks pulled down 11 rebounds and Mitchell

had 10. Dan Issel led the Nuggets with 28 points, Alex English had 26 and 10 rebounds, and Vandeweghe added 22 points.

"This is about what I expected," said Denver guard Doug Moe. "I didn't think I could get charged up emotionally after our (mini-series) win in Phoenix Sunday."

In another Western Conference semifinal, Los Angeles had a 2-0 lead with a 112-100 triumph over Portland.

At Inglewood, Calif., Kawhi Leonard scored 37 points and Jamaal Wilkes hit an 18-point jumper to break a tie with the minutes remaining, lifting the Lakers. The series moves to Portland Friday night for the third game of the best-of-five series.

Abdul-Jabbar hit his field goal attempts in the second half and 15-of-20 for the game. Norm Nixon added 23 points for Los Angeles, while Johnson had 18. Wilkes finished with 14 for the Lakers.

The Eastern Conference semifinals take the stage tonight. The Milwaukee Bucks and the Boston Celtics play Game 1 of the series at Boston, and the Philadelphia 76ers hope to take a lead over the New York Knicks

## Edmondton blasts Black Hawks, 8-2

The Edmonton Oilers sent Chicago Coach Orval Tessier calling for a doctor.

"I've been in hockey for a long, long time and I've never been this embarrassed," Tessier said Tuesday night after the Oilers took a 2-0 lead in their Stanley Cup semifinal with an 8-2 thrashing of his Black Hawks.

"We'll probably call the Mayo Clinic for 18 heart transplants."

The Black Hawks have four days to recover, but it may not be enough.

The Oilers used a four-goal

outing from Glenn Anderson and a hat trick by Mark Messier. Anderson became the first Oilers' forward to score four goals in a playoff game since joining Messier and Gretzky.

Messier, the leading scorer in the playoffs, raised his total to 14. It was his third hat trick in the 1983 postseason, and him the first player ever to accomplish such a feat in a year.

Gretzky assisted on Anderson's third goal and his own record for most points in a year, including playoffs, set last season. The Edmonton scoring ace has 11 goals and assists in the playoffs.

Edmonton, unbeaten in its last 18 games at home, took Chicago for Game 3 on Tuesday night.

In the other semifinal, New York Islanders defeated Boston, 5-2, to take a 1-0 lead in their series.

At Boston, Bob Bourne collected a goal and two assists. Linemates Brent and Duane added goals. The Bruins seek to even the best-of-five Wales Conference final day night in Game 2 at the Garden.

The Islanders, who have won 11 of their last 13 playoff games, bolted to a 4-0 lead in the first 35 minutes and stood a brief Boston threat in the final period. Bourne scored his sixth goal of the playoffs breakaway to seal the win with 2:33 remaining.
