

One position ends in tie

Runoff fills Senate spots

In the runoff election Tuesday for the new Faculty Senate, all places were decided except for the place 1 position in the College of Agriculture, which ended in a tie.
Charles R. Shumway, professor agricultural economics, and Ethel Tsutsui, associate professor biochemistry and biophysics, tied with 102 votes each. The Faculty Senate steering committee will meet with both candidates today to decide the election.
Dr. Carl Shafer, agricultural economics professor, said

he does not know how the election will be decided. There is no procedure defined in the proposed by-laws of the Senate to deal with a tie in a run-off election, he said.

Texas congressman may not face charges

DALLAS — Flamboyant Texas Rep. Charles Wilson, D-Texas, probably will not face federal drug charges, a newspaper reported Tuesday.

Attorneys for the U.S. Justice Department were preparing a draft report that likely would recommend that Wilson not be prosecuted, the Dallas Morning News reported.

The recommendation, being drafted by the department's Criminal Division, will not be completed for final approval for several weeks, the sources told the newspaper.

Wilson, who lives in Lufkin, is among three known, current former lawmakers who have been under federal investigation to determine if they used cocaine or marijuana.

The Justice Department already decided not to prosecute former Rep. Barry Goldwater Jr., a California Republican, but is continuing its investigation of Rep. Ron Dellums, a California Democrat.

Although two men accused of operating a Washington cocaine distribution ring were extradited from Australia earlier this month, the newspaper quoted sources as saying it was unlikely that Doug Marshall, 27, and Troy Todd, 23, had any information incriminating Wilson. Wilson has been under investigation since last fall when Paul Brown, a convicted Texas swindler, charged Wilson was with him when drugs were used.

Betting bill boon to water fund

AUSTIN — For the first time in half a century, one house of the Texas Legislature has passed a bill to legalize parimutuel betting and, along the way, may have provided a boon to the state's Water Development Fund.
On an 18-13 vote, the Senate approved a bill Tuesday sponsored by Sen. Ike Harris, R-Dallas, who had held back the measure because he lacked the necessary 21 votes to suspend a parliamentary rule which governs the consideration of bills.
Shortly before Tuesday's session, Sen. John Montford, D-Lubbock, provided the needed vote for the bill which would dedicate 3 percent of all wagers made to the state's Water Development Fund.
The development fund is used to service bonds issued for reservoir construction and wa-

ter quality projects.
With Montford's support, the bill was released for a floor vote by a vote of 21-10, the minimum necessary. Once on the floor, Montford voted against the measure.

Afterwards, Montford, a former district attorney, said he was opposed to gambling but wanted to leave the question up to the citizens in the statewide referendum.

"I voted against final passage of the bill because I'm against gambling," Montford said. "But I'm always reluctant to impose my vote to block the people's chance to take a vote on the subject."

Although official calculations remain to be made, Montford's amendment could bring the beleaguered Water Development Fund \$80 million by 1988.

The bill already called for a 5

percent "take" of all bets to go to the state's Aid to Families with Dependent Children program.

The bill was forwarded to the House, where it probably will be considered next week.
