The two men used hacksaw

blades to cut through two sets of iron bars in the old jail.

The sheriff Monday announced the men sawed through the bars and then stole a red 1963 Volkswagen and are still at large. Officers believe the escapees are somewhere in the El Paso-Juarez area.

Armstrong said the men are both small and could have slipped between the bars after they were cut. They are believed to have escaped between 4 a.m. and 6:19 a.m., he said.
