National income up

United Press International WASHINGTON — The per capita personal income Americans rose slightly less than their cost of living last year, going up 5.3 percent to \$11,056, the Commerce Department re-

In 15 states, however, mostly in the Northeast, the increase was more than the national figure, the department's bureau of economic analysis reported Sunday.

State per capita personal income, said the report, ranged from \$15,200 in Alaska to

\$7,792 in Mississippi.
Although the national income figure rose by 5.3 percent, an adjusted figure showed an increase of 5.9 percent in cost of living.


