## Magnolia to receive help from company

MAGNOLIA — Students in the Magnolia School District will get a limited chance to play football and march in a band because of juggling the school budget and financial help from a major landholder in the district.

Mitchell Energy & Development Co. Tuesday pledged \$100,000 in emergency financial assistance to the district, including a \$75,000 prepayment of taxes totaling \$387,000 not due until January 1985 and a \$25,000 "challenge" grant to be matched by a fundraising drive among individuals and smaller local businesses in the school district.

Mitchell Energy & Development Corp. is not located in the

Magnolia school district, but officials said their future developments of The Woodlands will be in that area.

The Magnolia district in April voted to eliminate all extracurricular activities, including football, band and other athletic and music programs in response to a voter tax limitation measure which slashed \$1 million from next year's school budget.

Using the Mitchell money and other outside funds totaling \$130,000 and \$48,000 reallocated in the present 1983-84

school budget, school district officials said they will be able to reinstate football, girls' volleyball, basketball and track and field to a limited number of students on the junior high and high school levels next year.

However, soccer, swimming, baseball and girl's softball will not be reinstated.

Nick T. Bogner, president of the school board, said he hoped other companies like Mitchell Energy would come to the aid of the district.

"If other companies and individuals follow this lead, the short-term solution to the district's pressing financial problems may be found, helping save MISD programs and allowing the district time to unify the community and to plan wisely for the future," he said.

The school reopened later in the day.

## Water damage repair studied

GRAPEVINE — Water damage to the disused Braniff International world headquarters at Dallas-Fort Worth Regional Airport will have to be repaired before the multi-million dollar building can be leased to a new tenant.

The airport board's operations committee was scheduled to consider at its Thursday meeting a proposed \$38,000 study by Roof Engineering Inc., of Hobbs, N.M.

"There have been some leaks in the roofs and walls at Braniff Place which had caused some damage to the building," said board spokesman Jim Street.

"This is a contract to determine

the extent of damage and cost of repair."

Street said visible damage to the building, virtually since Braniff went bankrupt in May, included water stained carpets, blistering plaster, those things that water causes.

Street said structural damage to the building had not been terminated, and the present study would include a study of the building's foundation.

Street said the airport was negotiating with Telephone Co. as a tenant, but that deal would wait until the damage was repaired.

## Student ruled unable to be tried in murder

CANYON — A 251st District Court jury found a West Texas State University student incompetent to stand trial in the beating death of his roommate.

Both the defense and the state Monday concurred with the findings of two clinical psychologists that Shad Leith, 24, suffered from "chronic, severe mental illness" and was not presently able to stand trial.

Leith was ordered to return to the Rusk State Hospital near Tyler.

Victim Howard Terry also a student at West Texas State University, was beaten to death last December in a mobile home the two shared.

One psychiatrist, Dr. Paul Shaw, testified Leith could not have been sniffing ether at the time of the incident.

Dr. Leon Morris of Falls, testified that Leith suffered from paranoid schizophrenia, "a chronic mental illness."

Leith surrendered in Phoenix, Ariz., in January.

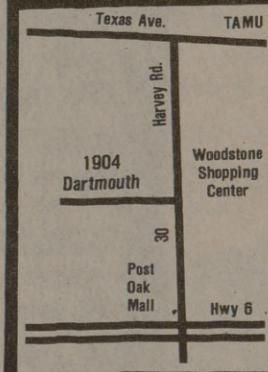

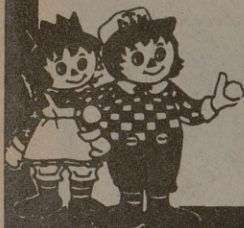
