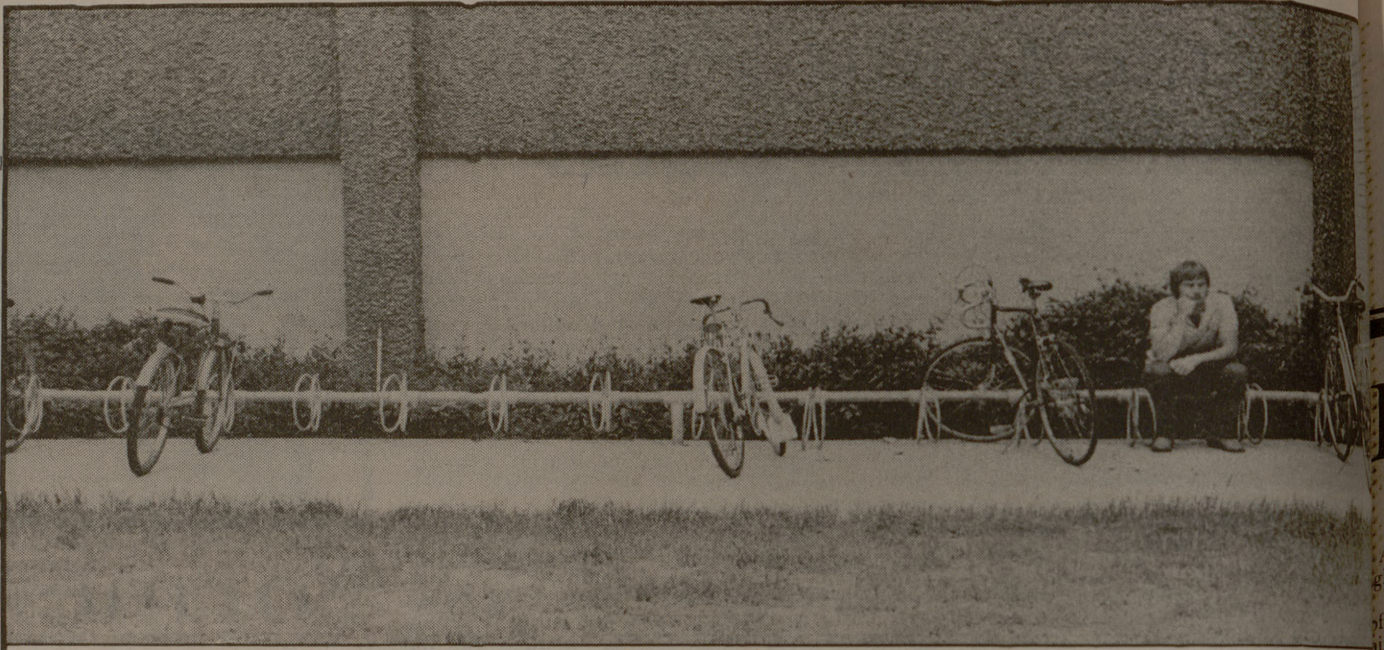

PLO chief claims Arafat 'impotent' against revolt

DAMASCUS — A mutinous faction of the Palestine Liberation Organization claimed PLO guerrilla chief Yasser Arafat is "impotent to move against" their widening revolt over his policies.

Arafat became a double target Monday, with PLO dissidents increasing charges he is leading the Palestinian movement to liquidation and the right-wing Voice of Lebanon reporting he narrowly escaped assassination.

The report on Beirut's Christian Phalangist Radio said gunmen on the Syrian-Lebanese border ambushed Arafat early Monday, killing the driver of his car.

"The report is completely baseless," said a spokesman for Arafat.

"Abu Ammar (Arafat's nom de guerre) is all right and nothing is wrong with him," added one of Arafat's close aides.

Arafat, hearing the broadcast in northern Lebanon, immediately cabled his Damascus office to assure his staff he was unharmed, the spokesman said.

The Palestinian news agency Wafa said the report was "completely devoid of truth." It said Phalangist Radio advocated "hostility to the Palestinian people and the destruction of their cause."

Phalangist militiamen massacred hundreds of Palestinians at two refugee camps in Beirut last September.

A spokesman for mutinous rebels within Arafat's mainline Fatah group said there were fundamental differences with

his leadership and claimed the rebels — Arafat estimated numbered about 150 — made progress in changing the PLO's course.

"We have succeeded in our first step. We've put the movement's leadership in the dock," said Abu Moussa, a leader of the revolt, in an interview with the pro-Libyan Beirut weekly, Al-Kifah al-Arabi.

"Arafat is impotent to move against us militarily," he said.

Nimer Saleh, another leader of the revolt, said the rebels were trying to prevent Arafat from accepting President Reagan's Middle East peace initiative.

Reagan's peace plan announced last September ruled out an independent Pales-

tinian state but called for a "entity" with Jordan in the occupied West Bank and the Golan Heights Strip.

"If we hadn't moved, we would be in Washington," said in an interview with Al-Kifah al-Arabi.

The PLO mutiny erupted three weeks ago in Lebanon's Bekaa Valley, where approximately 10,000 PLO guerrillas are stationed along with 40,000 Syrian troops.

The uprising was triggered by Arafat's appointment of PLO commanders in the field. He who, in the view of the rebels, performed poorly in the Israeli assault on PLO bases during the invasion of Lebanon last year.

Rebels pledge fight against 'intervention'

SAN SALVADOR — Leftist guerrillas, angry at "U.S. intervention" in El Salvador, have opted an offensive aimed at the agriculturally rich eastern half of the country.

"Not one more drop of American blood should be shed in Salvadoran territory in service of a cause that is inhumane and against our people's right to peace, justice and liberty," the rebels said.

Rebels stormed the town of Jocoero, 79 miles east of San Salvador on the strategic highway, cutting the route five hours before withdrawing officers said.

Four guerrillas and one officer were killed, and the said it deployed 500 guerrillas from the nearby garrison in Miguel to hunt down guerrillas around Jocoero.

Venceremos announced major guerrilla assault on army communications center a 4,990 foot volcano with an antenna at its peak which served as a relay center.

Indicating a major push eastern El Salvador, rich in cotton and coffee, Venceremos broadcast transmissions warning citizens in the zone to be prepared for combat.

The guerrillas are calling their offensive "In Front of Aggression of Reagan, El Salvador Shall Overcome."

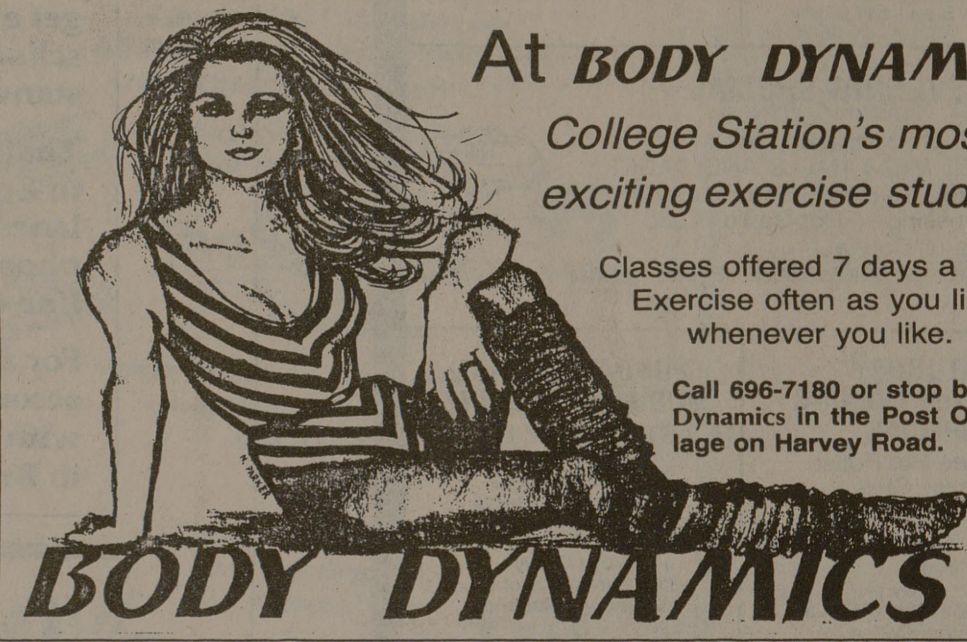

Billing Napoleon for old debts

BOURG-ST.-PIERRE, Switzerland — Leaders in an Alpine village want France pay an outstanding \$150 million Napoleonic debt.

Napoleon in May 1800 signed a letter promising to pay for all damage, use of local and rental of mules. An equivalent to \$22,500 today sent to Paris but never honored the village says.

It intends to present a letter to French President Francois Mitterrand when he pays an official visit to Switzerland.

At the French Embassy in Bern, however, spokesman Andre Villebreux said the Napoleonic debt was paid in part of the \$14 million awarded Switzerland by the Congress of Vienna.

Bourg-St.-Pierre Mayor Roland Dorsaz conceded the village did receive \$7,500 at the time but said Mitterrand should make up the remainder.
