

'Rock-out' against leukemia

Crestview Retirement Community of Bryan is inviting everyone to "rock out" this Saturday during the Rock N'Roll Jamboree for The Leukemia Society of America, Inc.

There will not be any electric guitars or drums, but there will be plenty of rocking chairs for all participants of the "rock-a-thon" to raise money for the Houston chapter of the society.

The jamboree will be held Saturday at Post Oak Mall from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

"Our goal is to have 100 participants," says Janet deGuzman, activity director at Crestview. She adds that rockers of all ages are invited to participate in the charity fund raiser.

DeGuzman says Crestview is seeking volunteer help as well as participants for the jamboree. Volunteers are needed to help

solicit donations for support, materials and sponsors for Crestview residents who are planning to rock.

Sponsor sheets for jamboree rockers are available at all of the local McDonald's restaurants, she says.

The jamboree is part of a network of similar events held annually in many communities across the nation. Organized by the American Health Care Asso-

Judge holds pair on murder charge

SHREVEPORT, La. — A state judge in north Louisiana says there is probable cause to continue holding two Colorado men in a grisly double slaying in motel.

After hearing nearly two hours of testimony from police detectives, Judge Jeff Victory ruled Monday there was enough evidence to hold Steven Kelso, 34, and Keith Allen Hines, 28. The men were jailed on two counts each of first-degree murder and one each of unauthorized

use of a motor vehicle and one each of kidnapping. The judge ruled there was not probable cause to hold the pair on aggravated rape and aggravated kidnapping charges.

Victory heard graphic testimony from detectives who took statements from the two suspects after their arrest in Atlanta, Texas.

Assistant District attorney Howard Fish said the case would be presented to a Caddo Parish grand jury next week.
