Cubs continue record streak with 2-1 defeat of NY Mets



The Chicago Cubs, who haven't won the National League
pennant since 1945, at least
partly due to their punishing schedule of summer day home games, are on their best streak in more than five years.

Keith Moreland singled in Leon Durham with two out in the bottom of the ninth inning Wednesday to cap a two-run ral-ly and lift the Cubs to their seventh straight victory, a 2-1 decision over the New York

The win gave the Cubs their longest winning streak since late May 1978, when they won eight

"When you're winning, that's how things go," said Chicago Manager Lee Elia, whose club is unbeaten June. "We used all 27 outs they gave us. That's how it goes when you've got momentum."
