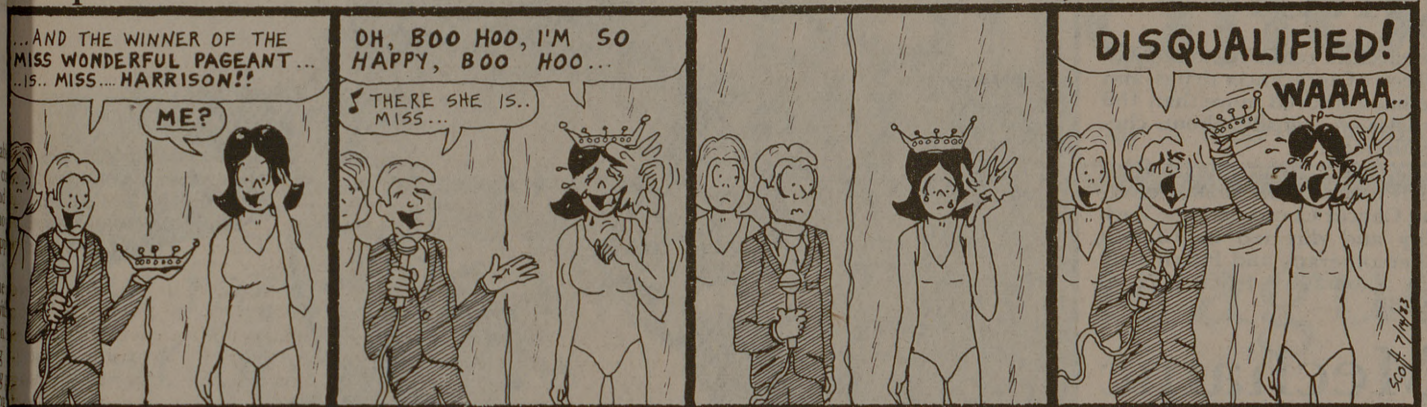

Sheriff's case goes to trial

DALLAS — Dallas prosecutors said Sheriff Don Byrd did not respond to a plea bargain offer in his drunken driving case and the case would go to trial Monday.

was taken to after his April 17 accident that reportedly have shown that Byrd was legally intoxicated.

Defense attorney Douglas Mulder last week asked the judge not to admit any evidence from the blood tests administered after the wreck. Grand

jurors reportedly said the tests showed Byrd's blood level to be nearly double the level constituting legal intoxication.

Mulder said the evidence was illegal, since it was obtained without the required constitutional warnings, the assistance of counsel and Byrd's consent. Burnham called Mulder's

The district attorney's office had offered Byrd a plea bargain under which the sheriff could plead guilty in return for a \$400 fine and a probated sentence.

Testimony OK'd in rape case

NEW ORLEANS — Testimony given by five Southern University football players to a grand jury can be used at their trial on charges of raping a woman at a hotel after a football

game last fall, a judge has ruled. Criminal District Judge Dennis Waldron Tuesday also refused to throw out charges against the five players, clearing the way for their July 28 trial on charges of aggravated rape.

Thomas Hudson, 21, Ernest Bell, 20, and Herman Coleman Jr., 20, all of Houston; Kim Ray Davis, 20, of Atlanta, and Linwood Hamilton, 25, of Easton, Pa., are charged in the Nov. 28 incident.

They are accused of raping a New Iberia woman, 25, in a Canal Street hotel on the morning after Southern defeated archival Grambling in the Bayou Classic at the Superdome.

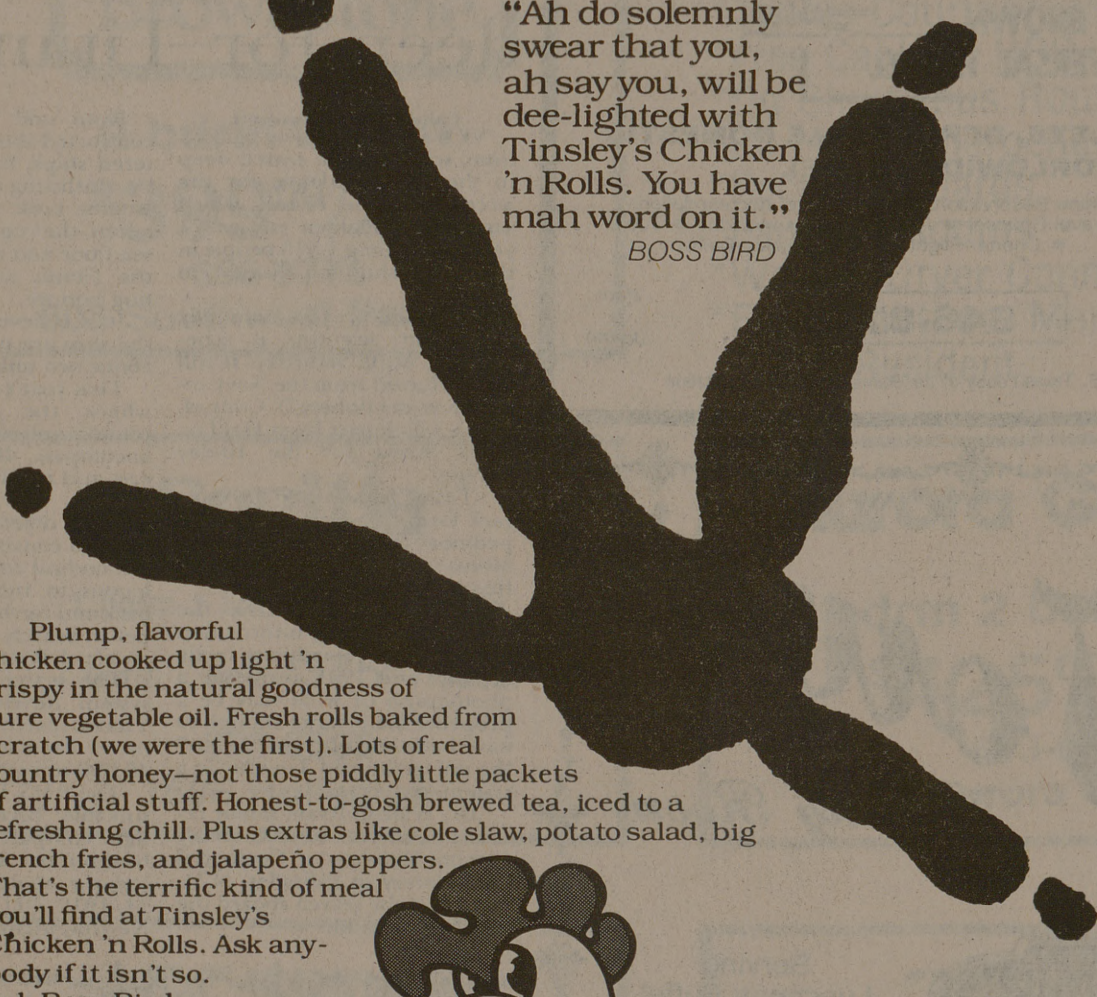

Any student who fails the written examination (EPE) must satisfy the English Proficiency requirement designated by his/her respective department.
