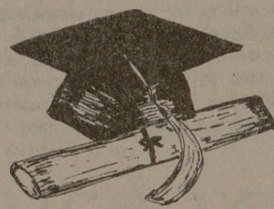

Light company awaits funds for lignite mine

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. — Arkansas Power and Light Co. should know this month whether the federal government will consider putting up more than \$2 billion in loan guarantees and price supports to develop a lignite mine in southern Arkansas.

AP&L submitted the request to the United States Synthetic Fuels Corp., which was created by Congress to act as the government's "investment banker" in developing alternate fuels.

The Synthetic Fuels corporation must tell AP&L by Aug. 25 whether its proposal is competitive. If so, the utility will have until Oct. 25 to submit a detailed technical proposal.

AP&L asked for \$1.6 billion in loan guarantees and \$640 million in price supports for a gasifier, pipeline and other facilities that would be located near Hampton in southern Arkansas.

Ralph Mitchell, AP&L vice president for conservation and renewable resources, said last week the request was a "long shot." But when the Synthetic Fuels corporation asked for proposals to use the low-grade coal that is found in Texas, Arkansas, Mississippi and Louisiana, the only proposal from AP&L.

The utility has also encouraged recently by southern Arkansas industries that are interested in that region, he said. Also, engineering Co. wants coal gasification process originally developed in use, he said.

Classic musical replay same theater years later

DALLAS — They came in their Sunday best, or their Judy Garland T-shirts, and one woman even thumbed her nose at the Texas summer by wearing an ermine stole, to see the touted re-issue of "A Star is Born" at the opulent theatre where it played 29 years ago.

The Garland musical classic recently was restored to its original 181-minute length by the sometimes disconcerting insertion of still photographs and bits of film.

Sunday's finale screening of the movie was attended by costar James Mason and Ginger Rogers, an active supporter of the film restoration project of the Academy of Motion Pictures Arts and Sciences.

Fay Kanin, president of the academy, said "A Star is Born" will be shown in August at the Venice Film Festival. Warner Brothers, which owns the film, plans to study the reaction to the six-city special engagement that began at Radio City Music Hall to decide whether a general release would be profitable.

A fading film clip of festivities at the September 1954, Hollywood premiere of the George Cukor movie introduced the film.

In it, Greer Garson, a part-time resident of Dallas since her marriage to businessman Buddy Fogelson, drew laughter when she said, "My mother is going to Texas."

In an introductory movie itself, Mason, an evening especially prepared because he had so much to do with the film, said the actor, 75, was in the appropriately Majestic Theatre, and women in evening dress on the carpet beside him for autographs.
