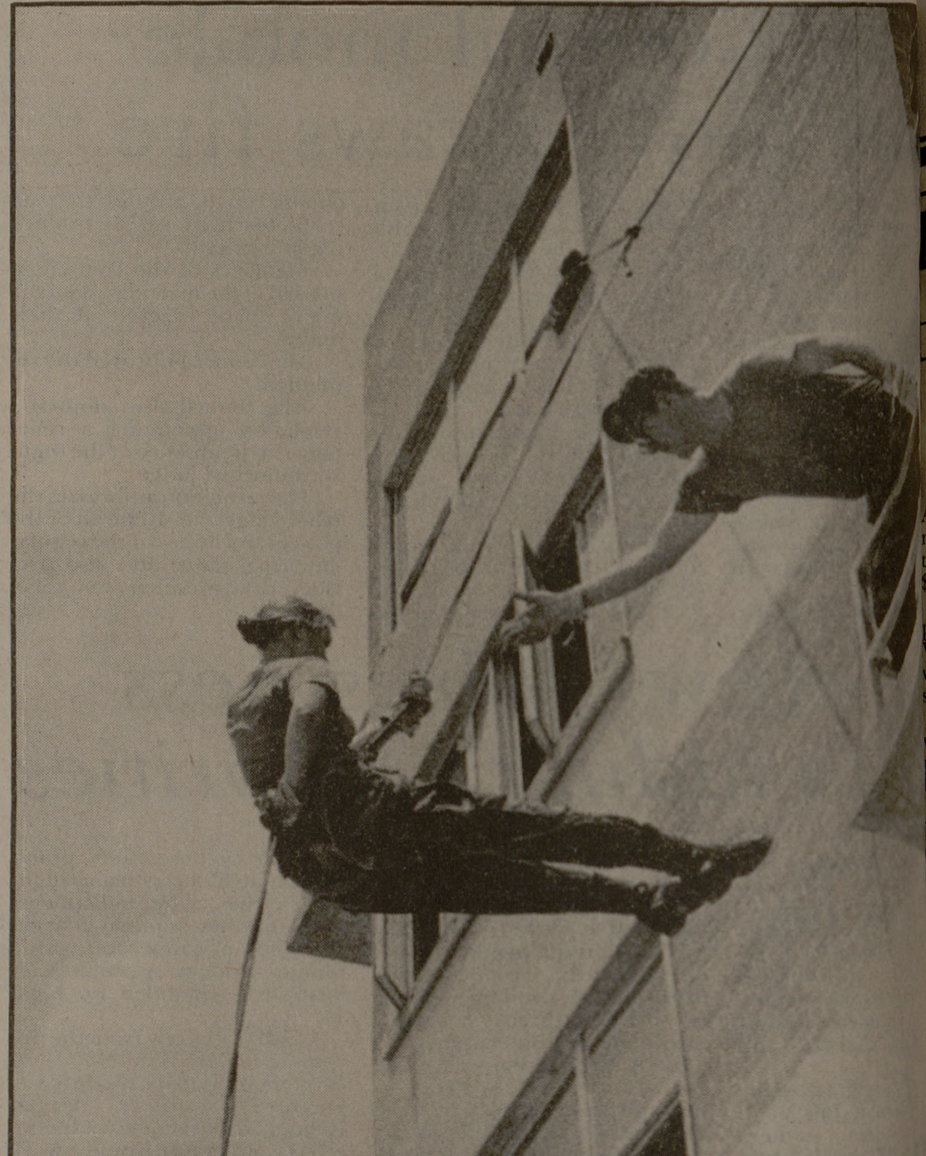

One killed, 28 injured in Tokyo earthquake

TOKYO — An earthquake that rumbled through the Tokyo area Monday touched off landslides that damaged homes, disrupted train service, killed one person and injured at least 28 others west of the city, police said.

The tremor measured 5.8 on the Richter scale and was felt for about one minute, officials said. The government's Meteorological Agency said the quake was centered in the western part of Kanagawa Prefecture near the foot of Mount Fuji, just west of Tokyo.

Agency officials said there were more than 23 aftershocks but ruled out the possibility that a major tremor would follow.

The National Police Agency said one person was fatally injured by a falling stone in Kanagawa Prefecture. At least 28

others were reported suffered slight injuries gawa and Yamamashi tures near the center tremor.

The quake triggered slides, destroying or damaging four residential homes, agency said. It also cut electricity to 844,000 homes.

Police said the quake caused \$80,000 in damages. No one was injured, police said.

Police say leftist extremists take credit for bombings

HAHN, West Germany — West German and American authorities searched Monday for left-wing extremists who exploded two bombs in a U.S. Air Force officers club only hours before a large anti-nuclear protest at a NATO air base.

The explosions at 3 a.m. Sunday shattered windows and damaged a wall and ceiling at the club near Coblenz, about 40 miles southeast of Bonn, causing

\$80,000 in damages. No one was injured, police said.

San Salvadorian government searching for leftist guerrillas

SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador — Government troops, including three elite battalions trained by U.S. Green Beret advisers, hunted leftist guerrillas filtering back into a pacification zone in San Vicente province.

Officers said that the operation around the eastern San Vicente province town of Tecoluca was in full swing Sunday as about 2,000 troops fanned out northward toward Chinchon-

tepec Volcano, 22 miles east of San Salvador.

Other troops also were deployed north of the volcano around the town of San Lorenzo combating rebels since late Saturday and trying to block guerrilla movement toward the key Pan American highway that passes through the area, officers said.

Millionaire's death possibly linked to alterations of will

LOS ANGELES — "Significant" alterations in Henry Harrison Kyle's will have resulted in a police investigation of a possible conspiracy in the slaying of the millionaire TV executive, it has been reported.

Investigators found in Kyle's briefcase a copy of a will on which the alterations had been made in pencil. Detective Bob Grogan told the Los Angeles Times Sunday. Grogan refused

to describe the alterations. "Henry Kyle was proposing significant changes in his will that legally were never filed," Grogan said.

An unaltered will, prepared in 1978, was submitted to probate in Dallas, where Kyle was based, six days after he was shot. The will left all of his \$22 million fortune to his sons Rick, 20, and Scott, 19. A \$100,000 bequest was left to a daughter, Paula Holtzclaw, 34, and \$10,000 was left to Kyle's youngest daughter,

Jackie Phillips, 28. Kyle's Vicki Yang Tu, a Taiwan estate executive he succeeded eight months before slaying, was not named in the will.

Kyle, president of Fox Productions, was shot in the morning hours of Aug. 3 along with his son, Rick, millionaire's 1930s Spanish home. Rick Kyle was hospitalized for a bullet wound in his left elbow.
