Texas editors to meet

Texas A&M's Center for Education and Research in Free Enterprise is hosting a conference for Texas newspaper editors Friday and Saturday in San Antonio.

The conference — titled "The U.S. Economy in the 1980s" — will focus on state and national economic issues.

This is the first such conference for the center. About 65 to 70 people are expected to attend. A representative from Business Week magazine in Houston, the San Antonio Chamber of Commerce, United Press International and the Associated Press will attend the conference, said Brenda Pejovich, student worker for the center.

Pejovich along with Janet Joyce, publications director for the center, coordinated the event by compiling the information, making the schedules for the weekend, making reservations and inviting the 12 guest speakers.

Speakers and their topics include:

- Bill Bret, chairman of the board and chief executive officer, A.S. Hansen, Inc., Dallas — "A Businessman's Recommendation to President Reagan"

- Dr. Edwin Feulner, president of the Heritage Foundation in Washington D.C. — "President Reagan's Foreign Policies and American Influence Abroad"

- Representative Phil Gramm — "The Economic Objectives of the Reagan Administration"

- Harry Hubbard, president of Texas AFL-CIO — "The Future of Labor Unions in Texas"

- Dr. Ray Marshall, secretary of labor during the Carter Administration and currently an economics professor at the University of Texas — "A Critical Appraisal of the Economic Objectives of the Reagan Administration"

- Charles Maurice — professor of economics at Texas

A&M, "Major Economic and Social Problems in the United States and Their Causes and Effects"

- H.B. Zachry, San Antonio, businessman and entrepreneur — "The Evolution of Jobs — The Destiny of the U.S.A."

Opening remarks will be given by Dr. Gordon P. Eaton, Texas A&M provost and vice president for Academic Affairs; Lawrence White, chairman of the board of the Center for Education and Research in Free Enterprise; Carl Raba Jr., a director of the center from San Antonio and Dr. Steve Pejovich, director of the center at Texas A&M.

San Antonio mayor Henry Cisneros will present a welcoming speech at the beginning of the convention.

Pejovich said the purpose of the conference is to make a contribution toward better understanding of the economic events of today by the people responsible for forming public opinion.

Two deans appointed

Dr. Melvin Friedman and Dr. William Mobley both were appointed to dean positions this summer.

Friedman, appointed dean of the College of Geosciences, has been a member of the geology faculty since 1967. Friedman was associate dean of geosciences last year and was director of the Center for Tectonophysics for three years.

Earlier in his career, Friedman was a field geologist for the Geologic Survey of Newfoundland and held several key positions with the Shell Development Co.

Friedman holds a bachelor's and master's degree from Rutgers University and a Ph.D. from Rice University.

Mobley, appointed dean of Business Administration, has been a member of the Texas A&M faculty since 1980. He served as professor and head of

the Department of Management and was promoted to associate dean of the college in 1981.

Before coming to Texas A&M, Mobley was professor of management and director of the Center for Management and Organizational Research at the University of South Carolina.

He received his bachelor's degree in psychology at Denison University in Ohio and his master's and doctoral degrees in industrial psychology from the University of Maryland.

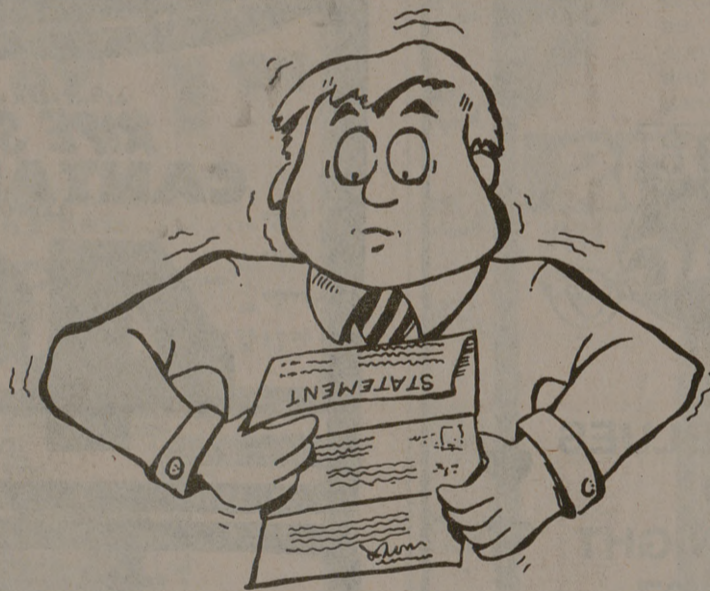
