## OFFICIAL NOTICE

## FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974 DIRECTORY INFORMATION

To comply with the requirements of the "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974," Texas A&M University must periodically announce publicly the policies and procedures implementing the act. Additional information is available from the Office of the Registrar.

The different types of student records are maintained in various university offices and the chief administrator in each of these offices is responsible for them. Generally, with certain exceptions, the law provides that students and former students have the right to review their records, request explanations concerning them, obtain copies and challenge records which they feel are inaccurate, misleading or otherwise inappropriate. The challenge procedure includes a full and fair opportunity for the student to present relevant evidence at a hearing. The law also provides that students may waive their right of access to confidential letters of recommendation and may also grant permission to release certain personally identifiable information.

The exception to this law, i.e., records not accessible to students, include educational personnel records in the sole possession of the author, records maintained for law enforcement purposes, employment records of non-students, records maintained by a physician, psychiatrist or psychologist and financial records of a student's parents.

The law also provides that in addition to University employees having a "legitimate educational interest," certain other governmental and quasi-governmental agencies and parents certifying that a student is carried as a dependent for income tax purposes may have access to student records.

The University can release "directory information" (such as name, address, telephone listing, major field of study, classification, date and place of birth, participation in activities and sports, height and weight of athletic team members and degrees and awards received, etc.); however, students may request that this information be withheld.

To request that such "directory information" be withheld by the University from public disclosure through such means as certification of enrollment, the campus directory, address and telephone lists for university organizations, etc., a student must complete and sign the proper form in the Office of the Registrar.

The student must realize that approximately one month is needed to remove this information from materials already in circulation. However, the campus directory is printed only once a year, and after printing, no information can be removed.

The student is responsible for renewing this request each September, and the validity of the requests extends from the date of the request to the following September 1st.

Individuals who have additional questions concerning the "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974" or who wish to withhold "Directory Information" must contact the Office of the Registrar, Texas A&M University by Friday, September 23, 1983.

## Delayed rites protested

**HOUSTON**—The husband of a slain woman said he was given an explanation as to why a Catholic priest was prevented by police from administering last rites to the dying woman at the crime scene.  
E.H. Ivey said Monday he was led by the Rev. Joe Crosthwait, Aug. 19 shortly after he was shot out his wife Fran Ivey and that other women were shot at by Shumate Realty Co. in Houston.  
Ivey said he was understandably barred from the crime scene, but was "shocked" when police did not allow the priest to enter the office to give Mrs. Ivey the last rites.

"When they refused to let Father Joe minister to my wife's spiritual needs, I just thought it was absurd," Ivey said. "This case of priorities and it looks like they put the victim's needs at the bottom of the ladder. I don't care if all the evidence was ruined if one soul or one life could be saved."

Crosthwait said he eventually administered the rite as Ivey was being carried to a stretcher to a helicopter. Crosthwait said he had to "muscle" his way through several uniformed officers to do so.

Mrs. Ivey, 52, died several hours later at Hermann Hospital. Also dead was the company founder Elizabeth Shumate, 46, and JoAnn Brown, 46. They had been in no arrests in the area.  
Crosthwait said he has been permitted to enter crime scenes many times in the past 20 years and has always obeyed official instructions not to touch anything.

"I'm not out to persecute police," he said. "But a Catholic it's important to be appointed."

## Prostitutes threatened

**SAN ANTONIO**—An assistant district attorney vowed Tuesday he would vigorously prosecute growing numbers of weekend prostitutes, who prey on the city's tourists for a few days and then leave town.  
Robert Arellano, chief of Bexar County's misdemeanor division, said growing numbers of prostitutes, mostly from Austin and Dallas, are renting rooms along northern Broadway street on weekends. They work for two or three days and then return home, he said.  
The street walkers come to San Antonio because they are arrested in other cities or just try out new territory, but their main objective is the large number of tourists.

Arellano said prosecutors would begin patrolling streets with the police department's undermanned vice squad in an effort to crack down on prostitutes.  
He promised officials would prosecute the women as long as they continued their weekend excursions.

## TV stations purchased

**Dallas**—Lin Broadcasting Corp. of New York announced Monday the purchase of two Texas television stations from Dallas-based A.H. Belo for \$104.9 million plus working capital.

The two stations are WISN-TV (Channel 8) in Indianapolis, Ind. and WANE-TV (Channel 15) in Fort Wayne, Ind.  
Lin owns five television stations, including KXAS in Fort Worth-Dallas, and KTVU in Austin. The firm also has 10 radio stations, including KILP and FM in Houston.

Belo, publishers of the Dallas Morning News, acquired the Texas stations as part of a package of six stations it purchased for \$606 million from DuPont Bradstreet June 20. Belo also owns WFAA-TV in Dallas, as well as radio stations in Dallas and San Antonio and a cable television system in Clarksville, Tenn.

Robert W. Dechard, executive vice president of Belo, said the company will have dispersed all broadcasting properties does not plan to operate in compliance with FCC regulations. He said Belo also plans to sell stations it operates in Beaumont and Chattanooga, Tenn.  
Dechard said Belo will proceed with its acquisition of KHOU-TV in Houston as part of the \$606 million package. He will not bid on the Houston station which was put up for sale.
