

United Press International AUSTIN — The rental housing market around the sprawling University of Texas campus has loosened up, making it easier for the more than 48,000 students who began classes Monday to find a place to live this fall.

There is much less desperation, not as much sheer utter frustration as there was two years ago," said Jenny Arnold, operator of Apartment Finders Service. "My agents are less frus-trated. We feel much less like the prophets of doom.

Property managers and rental agents agreed that there are mo

e rent houses and apartments in the campus area because of a boom in apartment and condominum construction and a cap on university enrollment. And students appear to be

benefitting from the oversupply of housing.

At least one apartment complex offered two months of free rent to students who signed a 12-month lease. And some offcampus dormitories lowered their rates slightly to draw more renters.

In addition to the increase in rental units, Solt and other property managers said condos have removed thousands of students from the rental market.

And they said the ceiling on university enrollment of fresh-men has lessened demand, while some students appear more will-ing to live in the numerous
