OFFICIAL NOTICE

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974 DIRECTORY INFORMATION

To comply with the requirements of the "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974," Texas A&M University must periodically announce publicly the policies and procedures implementing the act. Additional information is available from the Office of the Registrar.

The different types of student records are maintained in various university offices and the chief administrator in each of these offices is responsible for them.

Generally, with certain exceptions, the law provides that students and former students have the right to review their records, request explanations concerning them, obtain copies and challenge records which they feel are inaccurate, misleading or otherwise inappropriate. The challenge procedure includes a full and fair opportunity for the student to present relevant evidence at a hearing. The law also provides that students may waive their right of access to confidential letters of recommendation and may also grant permission to release certain personally identifiable information.

The exception to this law, i.e., records not accessible to students, include educational personnel records in the sole possession of the author, records maintained for law enforcement purposes, employment records of non-students, records maintained by a physician, psychiatrist or psychologist and financial records of a student's parents.

The law also provides that in addition to University employees having a "legitimate educational interest," certain other governmental and quasi-governmental agencies and parents certifying that a student is carried as a dependent for income tax purposes may have access to student records.

The University can release "directory information" (such as name, address, telephone listing, major field of study, classification, date and place of birth, participation in activities and sports, height and weight of athletic team members and degrees and awards received, etc.); however, students may request that this information be withheld.

To request that such "directory information" be withheld by the University from public disclosure through such means as certification of enrollment, the campus directory, address and telephone lists for university organizations, etc., a student must complete and sign the proper form in the Office of the Registrar.

The student must realize that approximately one month is needed to remove this information from materials already in circulation. However, the campus directory is printed only once a year, and after printing, no information can be removed.

The student is responsible for renewing this request each September, and the validity of the requests extends from the date of the request to the following September 1st.

Individuals who have additional questions concerning the "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974" or who wish to withhold "Directory Information" must contact the Office of the Registrar, Texas A&M University by Friday, September 23, 1983.

Gun-toting woman evicted from home

HOUSTON — The pistol Minnie Samuels kept to protect herself inside her home has cost the 81-year-old woman a place to live.

But her attorney, Grant Hardway, said Wednesday he will seek a court order to halt Samuels' eviction ordered by the Houston Housing Authority board.

The board ordered the eviction Tuesday night, but directed its staff to try to find the woman a new home. Samuels has lived in the Allen Parkway Village at the foot of downtown Houston for the past 17 years.

Her problems began in July when she fought with police who came to arrest her after she allegedly pulled a gun on a Houston Housing Authority public van driver who would not

let her board a crowded bound for the grocery store.

The van driver later, although he saw the Samuels never pointed a weapon at him. But Judge Stephens, the manager of project, said Samuels in has threatened other residents with the gun, and in one incident slapped another resident.

Samuels, who lives alone in the apartment, has said she keeps the gun because she has been assaulted in her home.

But housing authority members had little sympathy for Samuels' individual plight.

"If I had lived at Allen Parkway Village for 17 years and nowhere else to go, I think I would behave myself," board member Char Rothrock said. He voted to evict the woman.

"Our responsibility goes beyond one individual. We have to take into consideration all residents," board president H. Tollet said, though he expressed regret the housing authority had no facilities to deal with people like Samuels.

One board member, Zina Birney, voted against the eviction, saying "many of the elders have guns."
