

Lobster for students discussed

Steak, lobster and champagne may not be the usual university cafeteria food, but 140 lucky students here will get to sample these culinary delights each week.

A special steak and lobster dinner soon will be offered to about 140 randomly-selected students each week who are on meal plan, according to plans discussed Tuesday night at a Residence Hall Association meeting.

Although the program is still in the planning stage, Lloyd H. Smith, assistant director of Food

Services Department, said his department has encouraged RHA delegates and dorm council presidents to suggest ways of carrying out the dinner.

The gourmet fare will be formally served, but the champagne will be non-alcoholic. Curtains will be used temporarily to create a relaxing atmosphere for the dinner, which will be held in the Underground Railroad section in Sbis Dining Hall. Men should wear ties and women should wear dresses.

RHA, an advisory council, will be the link between the Food Services Department and stu-

dents attending the candlelight dinner.

Smith said RHA members will pass out an equal number of dinner tickets to male and female

students on meal plan. A person who is on meal plan can attend the special dinner free when in-

cluded by a winner. The cost will be \$25 for a date who is not on meal plan.

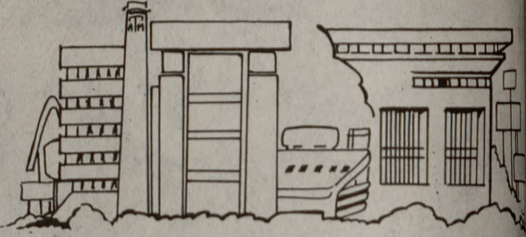
RHA members will be "guinea pigs" for the program, so workers can practice serving a formal dinner, Smith said.

Other action discussed at the meeting concerned RHA involvement in the 1983 United Way drive, which is scheduled for October. The president of Student Y Association said RHA should set a realistic goal of \$10,000 for the upcoming drive.

In 1982, RHA raised over \$3,000 for United Way. The

group was honored as the student organization which raised the most money during the drive. Residence halls sponsored United Way fundraisers such as dances, penny drives and car washes. Proceeds benefit 14 different United Way programs in the Bryan-College Station area.

In other business, RHA committees were introduced and their functions were explained. The five committees include: Programs, Casino, External Affairs, Public Relations, and Facilities and Operations. Each RHA delegate will join a committee.
